PRODUCTS MAKE UP FOR WHEAT LOSS

Hog Raising and Other Industries Aids Farmers in Tiding Over Bad Seasons.

PORKERS NOW SHIPPED IN CARLOAD LOTS

Some reasons why a poor wheat crop does not send North Dakota to the demeriton bow wows as it did in the good old days of yore are to be found in the following paragraphs:

One Bismarck produce house—the Northern Produce Co.—will churn this year 300,000 pounds of butter, manufactured from North Dakota butter fat which has paid the farmer an average of 28 cents the pound.

This same concern has purchased 200,000 pounds of poultry, produced as a by-product by central North Dakota farms. Three years ago this company found difficulty in buying 10,000 pounds.

To date the Northern Produce Co. has shipped from Bismarck 23 cars of eggs, and the season is not finished. The company operates as far west as Leach, east to Jamestown, covering all the Northern Pacific branch lines in that territory, including the Pingree-Wilton line, and on the North and South Soos. Some of the very best diversified farming territory, from the standpoint of the produce house, is being developed north and south from Bismarck over the Soo Line.

Market in the West
Bismarck Produce and commission houses now are receiving calls for poultry, butter and eggs in carload lots from San Francisco dealers.

The lowly hog is doing his share to dispel the one crop, complete failure bugaboo. W. A. Allison at Menoken learned the hog business in Iowa. Since January 1, 1916, he has sold \$2,700 worth of prime porkers, and he still has on hand 150 head of fat piglets, ready for the market.

In the vicinity of every creamery in central and western North Dakota, there could be pointed out at least one dairyman who is netting from \$100 to \$250 the month, the year round, from the sale of butter fat. With such a steady income, and with the constant enrichment of their

Hog Raising Developed.

Many Missouri Slope farmers already have developed hog raising to a point where they are enabled to ship in carload lots, thus eliminating the middle-man. Until this form of husbandry has generally progressed to such a point, it is urged that there is an important mission in this region for a good hog buyer. The excellent corn crop which is now being harvested will mean many more hogs next year, and the small grower will, it is urged, if given the advantage of a ready market, soon become a big grower.

Incidentally, Bismarck show windows are displaying some of the finest corn the Missouri Slope has ever produced. Large, well filled ears of both flint and dent varieties are the rule. D. T. Owens & Co. have in their window an ear of dent corn, raised by John Yegen, which measures 15 inches. There will probably be an excellent market next spring for every bushel of fully matured corn which is handled properly for seed.

Pessimism is a mighty scarce article in the Slope country this fall. Even the one-crop people, with wheat promising to hit the \$2 mark, are not feeling so badly as they might.

The loss on the Star restaurant, the building owned by G. C. Wachter and the restaurant fixtures and supplies by Frank Everts, is estimated at \$5,000. Mr. Everts is in Minneapolis.

Fred Monier's shooting gallery sustained a loss estimated at \$2,000.

Hits Telephone Service.
First seen the fire was bursting out of the northeast corner of the barn. How it started is a mystery. One theory is that the hay was ignited by a cigar stub and another that it started in the kitchen of the restaurant. The city was in darkness during the fire, but the repairs were soon made and the lights turned on. It put some 600 telephones out of commission, those east of Fifth street and south of the tracks for several days because of the burning out of

the cables which necessitates sending east for new cables. A big force of men will go to work today making repairs.
