## THE MARKETS

### WHEAT TAKES FRESH UPTURN

Price of Grain Closes Steady With Increase of 1 3/4 to 2 1/2 Cents Net Higher.

Chicago, Sept. 23.—Increasing anxiety for supplies, especially on the part of Europeans, gave a fresh upturn today to the price of wheat. The close was steady, at 1 3/4 to 2 1/2c net higher, with December at \$1.55 3/8 to \$1.55 5/8, and May at \$1.55 3/8. Corn finished 1/4 to 1/2c up, and oats with a gain of 1/2c. In provisions the outcome was unchanged to 15c higher.

When the day was over, foreigners had purchased 1,500,000 bushels of wheat on top of 1,600,000 bushels taken yesterday, but long before this fact was known, the trade had generally accepted a rise of cable quotations as showing decided uneasiness among European buyers.

Profit taking by holders of wheat checked the market a little in the last half hour, but new investors were encountered on all the dips, and there was no radical reaction. One of the reasons for the sustained strength was the fact that premiums for cash wheat at Omaha and Kansas City were the highest so far on this year's crop.

Corn sympathized to a moderate extent with the up turn in wheat. Besides, there was an improved demand from the seaboard, and it was said 40 per cent of the northern Iowa crop had been badly damaged by frost. Firmness of oats came about chiefly as a result of the bulges in other grain.


