THE MARKETS

WHEAT PRICES SOAR HIGH
STOCK MARKET AGAIN STRONG

Grain Advances 2-8 Net; Corn and Oats Respond to
Chicago, Oct. 2.—Emphatically bullish crop advices from Argentine today made wheat values go higher and higher. The close was strongest at 2 1/2c net advance, with December at \$1.56 1/2 and May at \$1.55 1/2. Corn gained 1/2c at 1 1/2c, and oats 3/4c to 1/2c. In provisions, the outcome ranged from 4 1/2c decline to a rise of 5c.

Drought ravages in Argentine began to lift the wheat market right from the outset, and there was no radical setback at any time during the session.

Special attention appeared to be given to dispatches from Rosario, the center of the dry district, telling of serious damage from the long continued lack of rain and saying that all the crops were suffering.

Notwithstanding that the United States' visible supply totals showed an increase of 746,000 bushels, the effect on the market was of but little, if any advantage to the bears.
