THE MARKETS

MARKET STRONG; LATER DECLINES

Bethlehem Steel Outstanding Feature of Day's Session; Goes to New Record

New York, Oct. 24.—The approach of the presidential election and attention paid to political considerations were accepted as the most plausible reason for the irregularities of today's later dealings after a forenoon of decided strength.

Prices yielded one to two points from their best declines, being effected on comparative light offerings. The last half of the session was characterized by frequent intervals of lull, trading from midday to the close barely amounting to one-third of the total of one million two hundred sixty thousand shares.

Bethlehem Steel was the outstanding feature of the morning, rising 44 points to the new record of 629, but closing at 616. General Motors, also, scored a new maximum at 837, and American Beet, Cuba Cane, and Cuban American Sugars were lifted to record quotations together with General Leather, Utah Copper and Consolidated Gas and Electric of Baltimore.

Aside from its winted leaderships to activity, United States Steel pursued a comparatively normal and narrow course, making a net decline of one and one-eighth after a temporary advance of a fraction.

Continued irregularity of the bond market was traceable to further selling of internationals, especially Anglo-French 5's. Total sales of bonds, par value, of \$6,570,000.
