THE MARKETS

WHEAT PRICES STILL STRONG

Market Closes Unsettled With Slight Advance; Corn Remains Firm

Chicago, Oct. 28.—Unabated demand from export houses and foreigners added sharply today to wheat prices that were already well above the record for the last 28 years. The market closed unsettled, one and one-fourth to three and three-eighths net higher, with December at \$1.88 1/2 to \$1.89 1/2 and May at \$1.86 1/4 to \$1.86 5/8. Corn finished unchanged to five-eighths cents down, oats up one-eighth cent to five-eighths cent and the active month in provisions varying from the same as yesterday's close to a gain of thirty-five cents. Rapidity of the advance in wheat rather than changes in bullish conditions formed the chief basis of profit taking which holders indulged in during a considerable part of the period. The swiftness of the rise was shown by the fact that top prices today were 19 1/2c higher than last Saturday's close, and 33c from the low point of the week before the present.

STOCK MARKET IS IRREGULAR

Bank Statement Meets Expectation With Cash Gain of \$20,000,000

New York, Oct. 28.—Stocks were irregular almost from the outset of today's brief, but active session. Standard investment issues were moderately lower and comparatively neglected while copper and those specialties which recently figured so extensively in the daily operations were decidedly strong. The bank statement met popular expectations in its actual cash gain of about \$20,000,000, a loan expansion of nearly \$3,000,000 and an increase of over \$11,000,000 in reserves.
