Dr. W. F. Crews, Secretary of State Sanitary Board, Wires for Advice

North Dakota has not yet joined in the embargo against the importation of live stock from districts supposed to be affected by the hoof and mouth disease.

Dr. R. H. Treacy, district director for the United States bureau of animal husbandry, and Dr. W. F. Crews, secretary of the North Dakota livestock sanitary board, are closely watching the situation, and they are prepared to act immediately if it shall be deemed necessary.

Dr. Crews today advised the Tribune that he has wired federal officials for instructions. At present no emergency seems to exist, but all possible vigilance will be exercised in an effort to prevent the exposure of Bismarck livestock.
