#### LATEST DEMOCRATIC TALE

Story Current That E. H. Stenvick, of Minot, Will Succeed Burke as United States Treasurer

Minot, N. D., Dec. 1.—A story is current in local political circles that after March 4 next, E. H. Stenvick, of this city, is to be treasurer of the United States. It is stated in connection with this story that John Burke will be appointed to the first acceptable vacancy in the federal judiciary.

#### PEMBINA COUNTY FARMER SUCCUMBS TO INJURIES

Pembina, N. D., Dec. 1.—J. N. Fritchard, fatally crushed in a tractor engine accident several days ago, died in the Winnipeg hospital this week. He stepped into the cogs of a traction machine. His legs were terribly mangled. Amputation followed, but loss of blood was too great.

#### SEES HAND OF CHILD IN WATER—LITTLE TOT SAVED

Minot, N. D., Dec. 1.—J. B. Trotter, who is employed in the Great Northern yards, saw the hand of a baby sticking out of the water in the river in the vicinity of Park avenue and First street northwest, while going to lunch yesterday. He grabbed an old bed-spring and using this to support

his weight, rescued Thomas, the three-and-a-half-year old boy of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Loberg of this city. Heroic efforts were used to restore the life of the little fellow, which were successful.

#### GRAND OPENING OF NEW ANAMOOSSE HOTEL, DEC. 15

#### HANSBORO WOMAN BURNED—CLOTHING CATCHES FIRE

Hansboro, N. D., Dec. 1.—While preparing to do the family washing, Mrs. George Sutherland narrowly escaped serious burns when her clothing caught fire. The flames were smothered by her husband with the aid of bed clothing.

#### ATTORNEYS COMPROMISE IN DEGREE OF HONOR CIVIL SUITS

Jamestown, N. D., Dec. 1.—Two civil cases, in which Arthur and Dora Rabinowitz, jointly, and Annie Flierman, brought suit against the Degree of Honor, A. O. U. W., in an attempt to recover insurance premiums, were settled at the special term of district court here. Attorneys for both parties compromised, the defendants paying \$500 to each.

#### REGENT MAN KILLED WHEN AUTOMOBILE TURNS TURTLE

Mott, N. D., Dec. 1.—B. H. Olson, of this village, was instantly killed on Tuesday afternoon when his automobile turned turtle ten miles south of this place. He had been dead for several hours when found. His neck

was broken. Olson, who was a former hotel man, was 35 years old. A widow and five children survive. The body has been taken to Jackson, Minn., for burial.

#### RUBY THEATRE FIRE LOSS AT JAMESTOWN ABOUT \$2,000

Jamestown, N. D., Dec. 1.—The Ruby Theatre, which was badly damaged by fire Tuesday evening, has been reopened. Manager Leen of the playhouse estimates his loss at \$2,000, part of which was covered by insurance. After the theater was packed to capacity, all escaped without injury. The operator, Harry Gregg, suffered severe burns. A panic ensued when the flames were noticed by persons in the audience, but strenuous work of employees quelled the disorder.

#### MAY COMMENCE WORK ON EQUITY PLANT ABOUT JAN. 1

Jamestown, N. D., Dec. 1.—Shares in the new Fargo Equity plant have been disposed of rapidly in Stutsman county, according to W. C. Ochampaugh, who has been working as representative of the new project in this section of the state. "Some \$20,000 worth of stock has al-

ready been disposed of in this county," said Mr. Ochampaugh, "and the farmers seem anxious to aid the proposition. To date \$100,000 worth of stock has been sold and I have several large sales in sight at the present time. If the rush for stock continues I firmly believe operations will be commenced January 1, 1917, instead of April 1, as was formerly planned by those at the helm."

Surrey, N. D., Dec. 1.—Emil L. Johnson, formerly of this place, was gored to death by a mad bull on a farm near Mitchell, S. Dak., according to word reaching here. His mutilated body was found near the pasture gate by members of the family.

#### FLAXTON SCHOOL TEACHER SAVES FARMER'S LIFE

Flaxton, N. D., Dec. 1.—Miss Rebecca Peterson, a teacher in the rural district, heard cries of distress this week. She hurried to the scene and found Jens Hanson, a farmer living northeast of this city, suffering serious injuries. He fell from a wagon load of straw, the wheels passing over his leg, fracturing both bones above the ankle.

#### LONG SENTENCE GIVEN FORGER BY JUDGE COOLEY

Grand Forks, N. D., Dec. 1.—Pleading guilty to the charge of forgery, E. L. Zelesu, alias Michael Szekore, was sentenced to two years and six months in the state penitentiary Monday by Judge C. M. Cooley. Zelesu was charged with forging the names of A. J. Leonard, of Edmore, N. D., to a check for \$50.50, accepted by George A. Schwam, a local clothier.

#### RETURN TO STATE AFTER 24 YEARS' ABSENCE—TO LOCATE

McKenzie, N. D., Dec. 1.—After an absence from North Dakota for 24 years, Horace Fafrechld, of Bridgeport, Conn., a brother-in-law of L. E. Gagner, one of the pioneers of Burleigh county, returned last week for a visit. He was so well impressed with conditions that he returned home with the intention of disposing of his butcher shop and to make this state his home once more.

#### FARGO STATION HEARS AN OVERSEA WIRELESS MESSAGE

Fargo, N. D., Dec. 1.—A wireless message flashed from Hanover, Germany, to Tucketown, N. J., was picked up at a Fargo wireless station last night. It is the first message from beyond the Atlantic to be received here this fall. The return of colder weather makes possible the flashing of the electric waves half way around the world, local operators say.

#### GIRLS SELL THEIR TIN-FOIL TO RAISE FUND FOR PARTIES

Appleton, Wis., Dec. 1.—Prevented by the high cost of living, from giving so many to dancing parties as they wished, the Kappa Alpha Theta sorority of Lawrence college, has hit upon the plan of collecting tin-foil, selling it for 50 cents a pound and using the proceeds for dance money. Other sororities are adopting the scheme, while in the meantime curls have gone out of fashion at Lawrence college.

#### GOLDEN CASE GOES OVER ANOTHER TERM AT MINOT

Minot, N. D., Dec. 1.—Edward Golden, arrested on a charge of first degree murder growing out of the notorious negro dance in the negro section of the city in which Frank Gregg was killed and for which Claude Peoples was found guilty and sentenced to serve life in the state penitentiary, waived his preliminary examination, and will be tried at the February term of the district court.

#### DAKOTAN HELD AS SWINDLER GIVES HIS WIFE LAST \$7.90

St. Paul, Minn., Dec. 1.—Little two-year-old Rosey Marthaler hugged her father, Jacob Marthaler, alleged farmer and "sky-pilot" swindler, in his cell a police headquarters yesterday. Marthaler went as he gave his meagre savings to his wife for Thanksgiving dinner. There was but \$7.90. "Make a good Thanksgiving for the children," he said. "We are Americans now, and even if you have only what I gave you, make the day a time for gladness and thanksgiving." Charles Brown, chief of the protective department of the Minnesota Bankers' association, charges that Marthaler cashed a forged personal check on the First State bank at Underwood, N. D., for \$1,100. He has been identified, it is said.


