NEW ADMINISTRATION.

Within a few weeks an almost entirely new administration will take up the reins of government. Changes are often good for the governed.

The welfare of the state is the essential thing. Partisan considerations should be forgotten and a general concerted effort to improve the state government take their place.

Governor Lynn Frazier has maintained a discreet silence since his election. He is a farmer, representative of a big majority of the bread-winners of this state.

Bismarck will welcome the new officials with a cordiality that is traditional. Governor Frazier should find the press and the public of the Capital City ready to support him in any measure for the benefit of the state.

Problems of marketing are vital issues. If the new regime can correct abuses on the boards of trade and secure better distribution and higher prices for the products of the soil, it will win the gratitude such efforts deserve.

Revisions in hall insurance laws, farmers' terminal elevators and other forms to correct current abuses will be thoroughly threshed out this winter.

As an agricultural state we have far too little to say relative to the marketing conditions under which our products are sold.

So far as Governor-elect Frazier is concerned, his demeanor has not been radical. He impresses one as a thinker and a man of deliberation.

The Tribune bespeaks for the incoming administration the same consideration and forbearance accorded those of the past.

Regardless of whose initiative the administration has been elected, it is an administration of the people of North Dakota.

As the duly elected representatives of the state, they are entitled to all possible support and encouragement.
