SCHOOL NOTES.

The high school students are looking forward to the new municipal skating rink which is being flooded. The new rink is located on Eleventh street, between Avenue A and Avenue B. Supt. Martin has been authorized by the school board to purchase 100 diplomas for the design for which was adopted at the last meeting of the board. School will not be resumed until Wednesday, January 3, instead of Tuesday, in order that the teachers, who live some distance from Bismarck, will not have to travel on New Year's day. It has been announced by Supt. Martin that pedagogy and psychology will be offered the second semester and that anyone who on graduating has those two subjects in addition to three senior reviews, will be given a second grade elementary teachers' certificate, good for two years anywhere in the state. The Juniors are practicing for the entertainment which will be given before the high school the Friday before Christmas. The high school has been put on a private telephone line and the number has been changed to 285. Miss Mellem has appointed six members of the Civics class to take part in a debate to be held next Wednesday. The question is: "Resolved, That There Should Be a Tariff For Revenue Only." Supt. Martin will go to Kansas City in February, to attend the National Convention of City Superintendents, which will be held in that city, February 25 to 28. The teachers' committee and Supt. Martin are arranging for a prominent speaker to deliver a commencement address, June 7, 1917. Who the speaker is has not been announced as yet.


