An offer was recently made to McKenzie from parties outside of Bowman.

Robert Miller, Well-Known Resident of Eddy County, Passed Away Yesterday Morning.

New Rockford, N. D., Dec. 29.—Robert Miller, a well-known resident of this community for many years, passed away at the home of his mother-in-law yesterday morning at 11 o'clock. He had been ailing for the past three months from cancer of the stomach. His wife died about a year ago. Three children, living at Grafton, survive him.

BUSINESS MEN PAY DOLLAR EACH FOR NIGHT OFFICER

Parshall, N. D., Dec. 29.—Parshall has grown to such a size within the last few years that the need of a night watchman is being felt. At a meeting of the town board this week, John Selkhan was appointed as the night officer. The business men will be asked to contribute a dollar a month toward the salary for the officer.

FARM HOME DESTROYED BY FIRE CHRISTMAS NIGHT

Valley City, N. D., Dec. 29.—The George Butler farm home, three miles from Leal, was burned to the ground Christmas night, the loss being total. The Butlers were in this city spending Christmas. The fire is supposed to have started from the kitchen stove while the hired men were doing the chores.

SEARCH FOR BODY OF ENGINEER IS ABANDONED

Moorhead, Minn., Dec. 29.—The search for the body of Paul Titke, Dilworth engineer on the Northern Pacific, who met death in the waters of Lake Traverse, while hunting with a party of railroad men on October 12, has been abandoned for the winter, but will be resumed with the breaking up of the ice in the spring of the year.

HORSE KICK IS FATAL

TO A BEMIDJI YOUTH
Bemidji, Minn., Dec. 29.—Leonard J. Story, son of P. J. Story of Puposky, died at St. Anthony's hospital here this week as the result of a horse kick received Saturday. A blood clot formed around his weak heart. The right leg was broken from the blow.

RELIEF FROM CAR SHORTAGE SEEN IN HIS ORDERS

Fargo, N. D., Dec. 29.—Relief for the car shortage, prevailing throughout the northwest, was seen here last night on information from Minneapolis that the Northern Pacific railroad has orders for 1,500 new cars, and that the Great Northern has 500 new cars under construction. Nearly two-thirds of the Northern Pacific addition are to be worked westward from the twin cities.

ARREST SUSPECT FOR KILLING OF VAN HOOK HOMESTEADER

Stanley, N. D., Dec. 29.—The murder of Frank Moorehouse in his home-shack near Van Hook, this county, last February, is laid at the door of Frank Kaczor, just arrested at the instance of county officials after a long extended inquiry into the crime. At the preliminary examination held in this city, Kaczor was bound over to the district court for trial, first degree murder being charged.

C. A. Moorehouse, father of the murdered man, has prosecuted a vigorous inquiry into the death of his son, and his efforts were partially responsible for Kaczor's arrest. Moorehouse was found dead in his home, a bullet wound in his head. The coroner's jury declared it murder, but couldn't name the guilty party. Now, ten months later, Kaczor faces the charge.
