




NEW GERMAN ATROCITY

Women Says Huns Cut Off Right Arms of Boys

Germans are amputating the right arms of every youth over ten years of age who falls into their hands, according to Mrs. Eugenie Guentler of Besancon, France.

As a result of war conditions she has lost 27 of her immediate relatives. She said that in Besancon there is not a youth over ten years of age who has not his right arm off at the elbow. Her grandmother, eighty-nine years old, was found dead with seven bayonet wounds, and two girl cousins, sixteen and eighteen years old, were attacked by the Huns, she said.

Publication of any news of the movements of merchantmen is prohibited in Spain. This is the first application of the new antispy law.

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
