

PEOPLE WANT REAL ISSUES OF CAMPAIGN

Voters Fast Tiring of Nonpartisan Camouflage and Hate Offensive.

OBJECT TO PERSONALITIES

Efforts of Lemke and Others to Inject Mud-Slinging is Condemned.

Fargo, N. D., Oct. 14.—The people of North Dakota we believe, are anxious to have an opportunity in this campaign of studying the real issues; that is the basis on which the cam-

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aign for the election of S. J. Doyle to the governorship is being conducted out, and we are confident that it is the line of action that will bring success to us on the fifth day of next November."

So said W. E. Byerly, chairman of the Joint Campaign committee in charge of the campaign for the election of Mr. Doyle today.

"There have been attempts and there will continue to be attempts to swing the discussion from the issues to personalities, but I am confident that the old Socialist trick of abuse and attempt at creating class hatred as the basis for voting will fail, simply because our people are thoroughly awakened to the real issues, and are determined to judge the candidates upon those issues.

"We are going before the people on the issues the Socialists themselves have created; we are confident of the verdict when our people are thoroughly informed as to the aims of the Socialists, and on what Socialism means to each individual within the state.

"The splendid attendance that is being accorded Mr. Doyle in his tour is the most potent indicator of the manner in which his attitude toward issues is being received. He is being greeted by larger and larger crowds wherever he goes, and the attempt of the Socialists to keep members of the Nonpartisan league from attending his meetings, has failed.

"It would be a sad commentary upon the citizenship of our state if, at this time, we let ourselves be governed by passion in the selection of officers and in passing on such momentous questions as are involved in the approaching election. That is what the Socialists are relying upon, and that accounts for some of the methods they have employed.

"An indication of the kind of campaign that is being made against Mr. Doyle is found in the attempt to show that the Washington administration is backing them. For instance, there is the case of George Creel, who has written a letter clearly showing that all efforts of the Nonpartisan league leaders to use his name in their behalf is without authority, and that he has not, in any sense of the word, endorsed them.

"We have, also, the action of Secretary of War N. D. Baker, who brands as a misrepresentation, words used by the Socialists in an effort to clear their own skirts.

"In view of these facts, and in view of many other incidents in connection

with this campaign, every voter owes it to himself to study the issues; to inform himself of what really is involved in the selection of the man who is to occupy the chair of governor of North Dakota during the next two years.

Mr. Doyle is presenting the issues in a clear, concise manner; our committee is doing the best it can in bringing before the people of the state

a clear statement of the pending issues; it is up to each and every man in the state to study these issues carefully, and cast his ballot according to his best judgment.

"The old cry of this being a contest between the 'city and the country' is false upon the face of it." The Nonpartisan league leaders just a few weeks ago were aided by two bankers in their attempt to cripple our campaign by laying charges against a solicitor for our financial committee, which charges were dismissed in a court of justice. That doesn't look as though the bankers were all lined up against the farmers' does it?

"There are about 65,000 farmers in North Dakota, yet the opposition candidate for governor received only about 28,000 of their votes in the primary election, when the city vote that went for him is taken from his total.

"The fact is that Socialism is the real issue—we are either for Socialism, or we are for individual property rights. There is no escape from that issue."
