

TOWNLEY CALLS SOCIALISTS IN TO VIEW WRECK

Medicine Men of the Tribe Seek to Resurrect Ruins of Lost Hopes.

TO TRY NEW GAS ATTACK Different Line of Offense and Defense Will be Adopted by Noparty.

Fargo, N. D., Oct. 22.—North Dakota is "in danger," North Dakota, from a political point of view, is so threatening that the National Nonpartisan League chiefs of the culture of the 1912 Clyde Hunsell, A. C. Townley, has been called to help mend things.

Saturday and Sunday Mr. Townley conferred in Fargo with the lesser luminaries in the National Nonpartisan League system, and the two day conference brought together a group of the most active and faithful of the corp of speakers and organizers.

Fear that the Socialist constitution will be rejected by the people at the polls on November 5; fear that Lynn Frazier cannot be re-elected governor, and fear that John M. Baer, whose campaign tour of the "first district has been such a fizzle, will not be able to beat Fred Bartholomew of Grand Forks, has brought the Nonpartisan chief back to North Dakota.

In the sudden change of front on the part of Mr. Townley is seen best evidence of what has happened in North Dakota. For months they the Socialists have been talking optimism, but they have awakened to the fact that something is going on, and that that something bodes ill for them. Mr. Townley has abandoned South Dakota and Minnesota to their fate, and comes back to the state that first gave him political prestige.

The call that brought Mr. Townley to North Dakota also brought together other stars in the Socialist system, including the following:

William Lankke, Mr. Townley's right hand man in the St. Paul offices, and whom he made chairman of the Republican state central committee of North Dakota, and who is author of "Crimes Against Mexico." Mr. Lankke has extensive investments in Mexico and at one time feared for their safety, so he wrote a book about Mexico. Here's what he has to say of President Wilson and Mexico:

"It ill becomes President Wilson to talk of the glory and sacredness of our flag. Others have made it great—his administration has disgraced it in the eyes of the world, and the only comfort that we can get out of it, is in the anticipation that succeeding administrations will again place it on high, and that the dark blot put upon it by this administration will be forgotten in the achievements of future."

A. E. Bowen, former Socialist candidate for governor of North Dakota, J. J. Hastings, president of the Consumers' United Stores Co., and financial secretary of the National Nonpartisan League, whose finances run to \$5,000 Marmon, automobiles, and who was only a few months ago a bank clerk drawing \$65 a month.

"Fearless" William Langer, attorney general of North Dakota, who "isn't discussing" the numerous complaints made by North Dakota cities against high gas and light rates, prosecution of which cases was entrusted to him, and long delayed.

H. A. Bronson, Socialist picked candidate for supreme court judge, and who will tour with Townley to seek votes.

John M. Baer, Democrat, running on the Republican ticket endorsed by Socialists.

Senator J. I. Child of Morton county, Nonpartisan, who voted for limited woman suffrage, and then attacked the constitutionality of the act in the courts.

It isn't known, outside of Socialist circles, whether or not Governor Frazier was in the city. Walter Thors as Mills, the Socialist recently indicted by the federal grand jury for violating the espionage act, may also have been in attendance, but no announcement of his presence has been forthcoming.

"Yellow Worker" Arthur Le Stour, "Bill" Hayward's confident and advisor, is believed not to have been in attendance.

In addition there were several of the corps of newspaper writers and other hangers-on, all in to get their orders.



THE WORK OF THE HUN IN AMERICA

Picture-Story of the Minnesota Tragedy



HUNDREDS DIED in forest fires in northern Minnesota, which, according to latest reports, are found to have been incendiary—the work probably of German spies. Twenty cities and villages were wiped out, and the death list, ever growing, has reached nearly a thousand, as reports continue coming in from beleaguered communities.

TOP PICTURE—Fallen trees browned down by the tremendous wind that the flames raised, blocked escape of

hundreds in the manner here shown. The family leaped before the horse ran into the trees. In one such case, searchers a little distance beyond, came to a scorched old, then a charred bit of a doll-cradle, net a piece of a little girl's skirt, and then the blackened bodies of the little girl, her father and mother, and two other children.

SECOND PICTURE—Eight bodies are in this group, photographed sixteen miles from Moose Lake. They

constitute the families of Frank Williams and Ivan Jalamea. Williams' body was found 75 yards away, while he had run for water.

BOTTOM PICTURE—The whole-sale grave in which scores of bodies mostly unidentified, were buried, half a mile north of Moose Lake. The grave is just a shallow trench, in which the corpses were laid side by side and then covered with earth and rocks.

disappeared. They have come to realize that they are facing a most formidable candidate in S. J. Doyle for governor, and they are finding themselves more deeply involved in the Socialist constitution problem each day. The Joint Campaign committee has at least 2,500 committee men active in North Dakota, and it is the cleanest kind of campaigning in which they are indulging. The fact that the Doyle workers have everywhere stuck to the issue has had a disconcerting effect on the Socialists, who have been compelled to abandon, in part, at least, their old plan of action, and are obliged to meet arguments on economic issues.

Another thing that is counting, too, is the war. The boys are writing home from the front, and they are writing intensely interesting and straight facts on the L. W. W. leadership that has held sway in North Dakota.

and importation of intoxicating liquors, the law of the state is precisely the same as it was before the last regular session of the legislature.

"We have still to reckon with a rider—a nice rider—which congress tacked onto the last section of a general appropriation statute. It was passed on March 2, 1917, one day after the pretended passage of our fake bone-dry statute. It is in these words: 'Whoever shall order, procure or cause intoxicating liquors to be transported in interstate commerce, except for scientific, sacramental, medicinal or mechanical purposes into any state or territory of which the law prohibits the manufacture or sale therein of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes, shall be punished as aforesaid by fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment not more than six months.'

"You will note this rider statute prohibits only the importation of liquor by interstate commerce, contrary to the laws of the state. It does apply only where the state law forbids the importation or sale of liquor. It would apply to this state if our fake statute were a law, but without any examination or inquiry the federal authorities have erroneously presumed that the fake statute is a law. Under our state constitution, section 217, a person has a personal right to import liquor for his own use and he has a right to import the same without the making of any affidavit or other proof. An order for a reasonable quantity of liquor for personal and family use is presumed to be legal just the same as an order for a sack of flour. The presumption is that every man is innocent until proven guilty and the legislature may not change that presumption. As the United States supreme court has held, it is not within the province of a legislature to declare a person guilty or presumptively guilty of a crime."

"Finally, the conditions of the state are alarming; the 'flu' is having its own way; it is reaping a harvest of death. If it be true as it is, that the free and legal importation of liquor is necessary in order to fight against influenza, pneumonia and other ailments, it behooves the officers of the law, the druggists and the express companies to act promptly in the matter or to assume responsibility for a harvest of death."

FORCING WAY SLOWLY

(By Associated Press.) With the Allied Armies in France, Oct. 23.—The allied troops were forcing their way forward slowly today. North of Valenciennes the British have forced their way almost through the Raines forest. On the entire front between Valenciennes and Tournay rains have made the progress slow.

The Germans on this front have followed their tactics of retreating through the night. The British had been able to establish contact with the enemy rear guard until the next noon.

There is good indication that the German line will not be defended for any great length of time. The entire country between Valenciennes and Tournay is as barren as a desert as far as the French inhabitants are concerned. Liberated refugees say that the Germans carry so much loot that they stagger on the roads.

REACH FERRE RIVER. London, 1 p. m., Oct. 23.—North-east of Laon, French troops have reached the line of the Ferre river, having made an advance of two or three mile son an eight mile front.

BRITISH TAKE ROMIERES. British Headquarters in France, Oct. 23.—The British in their attack today north of LeCateau are reported to have captured the town of Romieres, 1 1/2 miles northeast of Solesmes.

A good many prisoners, mainly in small groups, are being brought in. The Germans are fighting doggedly.


