KATE O'HARE'S VERDICT GETS AFFIRMATION

U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals Upholds Judge Wade's Sentence.

WILL SERVE FIVE YEARS

Fargo, N. D., Nov. 6.—The United States circuit court of appeals has confirmed the conviction of Kate Richards O'Hare, convicted of violating the espionage act and sentenced to five years in prison.

Kate Richards O'Hare, an international officer of the socialists, and a member of the committee which drafted the infamous St. Louis resolutions adopted as a socialist national platform was convicted at the last December term of the U. S. district court for southwestern North Dakota, sitting here. Judge J. M. Wade of Des Moines, Ia., presided and Col. M. A. Hildreth of Fargo, district U. S. attorney, prosecuted.

CLAIM VICTORY. New York, Nov. 6.—Republican National headquarters issued a statement early this afternoon claiming a majority of at least 5 and possible 6 in the U. S. senate.

NEWBERRY IN LEAD. Detroit, Nov. 6.—The election of U. S. senator in Michigan has narrowed down to a nip and tuck race with Commander Newberry maintaining a narrow lead over Henry Ford, democratic challenger.

A careful compilation from practically 75 per cent of the precincts of the state gave Newberry 173,173 and Ford 171,377.

With a few precincts still unreported Henry Ford has a majority over Newberry in Wayne County (Detroit) of 26,210.

SAFE MAJORITIES. Washington, Nov. 6.—Safe majorities for the republicans in both houses of congress were claimed by the republican national headquarters based on returns up to 11 o'clock this morning.

CLARK GAINS. St. Louis, Nov. 6.—Early indication that Speaker Champ Clark has been defeated are not borne out by later returns.

REPUBLICANS WIN. Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 6.—Incomplete returns compiled by the Lincoln Daily Star show republican congressmen have been elected in all six of the congressional districts.

McCurdy Still Leading. Friends of State Attorney F. E. McCurdy were pleased to find at noon that with 34 precincts reporting, including many of the league strongholds in which an eleven-hour runoff was started for Allen, the Patterson candidate, the incumbent still has a lead of 29 votes.

Woolidge led William Langer for the attorney generalship in Burleigh county by one vote at noon. The count was Langer, 911; Woolidge, 912.

Very little change is noted in the rural districts. The league territory is voting as solidly for the Nonpartisan ticket as it did in the primaries.

Frazier's gains have been made in the towns and villages rather than in the rural districts. This is largely due to the fact that we still have many republicans who will vote no ticket other than their own, regardless of circumstances.

MACDONALD POOR SECOND. With more than half of the Burleigh county precincts heard from, Miss Minnie A. Nielson, candidate for state superintendent of public instruction, retains a lead of more than 500 over Nell C. Macdonald, the incumbent.

Miss Nielson is making an excellent showing in the rural districts, receiving a very complimentary vote even in the strongest of league districts.

In the Burleigh county vote is any criterion, Miss Nielson should be elected by a safe margin. Unless Macdonald gets practically every vote in the 19 precincts yet to be heard from, Miss Nielson will go out of Burleigh county with a good majority to her credit.

LOOKS LIKE LEAGUE HOPE. Complete returns from 34 out of 54 precincts in Burleigh would indicate a return of the league legislative delegation to the house. Prater, who is high man on the league ticket, has 888 votes, and Helstrom, high among the democrats, 806. The 19 rural precincts still to be heard from are expected to increase the league lead, giving the Nonpartisan legislative ticket a margin of 100 or more.

RED CROSS FOLK MAY HAVE GIFTS FOR CHRISTMAS

The war trade board has decided that the nearest relative of any individual serving with the Red Cross, Y. M. C. A., the Knights of Columbus, the Salvation Army or similar organizations operating in connection with the military forces of the United States or its allies, or of individuals serving in the allied troops, may send such individual a Christmas package after filing with the Red Cross chapter nearest their home an affidavit certifying that they are truly the nearest relative, and that only one package has or will be sent.

The Red Cross chapter will then present the sender with a box similar to that being sent to the soldiers, and will inspect it in the same manner as it does those addressed to soldiers.

Bismarck people will call at the Red Cross office in the federal building for the approving of these affidavits, and for the boxes. They will also bring the packed boxes to the same office for inspection, and shipping.

SALE POSTPONED. On account of sickness in the family and due to the spread of the flu, J. L. Reid, who lives 5 miles north of Bismarck, has had to postpone his public sale. It was to be held on Thursday, the 8th, but has been called off till a later date, to be announced later.

LEAGUE GETS STIFF JOLT IN IDAHO BOUTS

Entire Townley Organization Repudiated and Republicans Selected.

Boise, Idaho, Nov. 6.—With half of the vote counted, not a single democrat has been elected on the state, congressional or legislative ticket.

Senator Borah is re-elected and Frank B. Gooding, republican candidate for the United States senate, has a majority of more than 3,000 over Nugent, his democratic opponent, who was endorsed by the league. The result indicates a complete and impressive defeat for the Nonpartisan league in Idaho.

Remains to Canada. The remains of Miss Loretta Odette, former head of Wean Bros' millinery department who succumbed the fore part of the week to Spanish influenza, will be shipped this evening on the North Coast limited en route to Canada for burial. The body will be accompanied by the mother of the deceased, who was summoned to Bismarck on Monday.


