CHINESE CLERIC VOTED FOR ABE

Late Shanghai Minister Fought for Union During Civil War

Shanghai, March 19.—The Rev. H. N. Woo, whose death has just occurred here, voted for President Abraham Lincoln and fought with the Union forces in America's civil war. He was 86 years old. He had acquired a smattering of English when Perry came to the Far East in 1854 to negotiate the treaty between the United States and Japan and when Perry's fleet returned the Rev. Woo went with it aboard the sloop of war Plymouth as a cabin boy. He saw three years of service in the war and returned to China in 1863 when the Taiping rebellion was at its height. Soon thereafter he became associated with the American church mission at Shanghai and in 1866 he had a large part in establishing what was known as the Jung Jen E. Chu, a free dispensary, from which has grown the St. Luke's hospital of today in Shanghai. He was ordained in 1880 and devoted the rest of his life to the work of christianity.

IRRIGATION RESULTS

Washington, March 19.—The results of irrigation on crop production as compared to non-irrigation are shown by an investigation of the Department of Agriculture in Colorado. Corn production on irrigated land last year was 30.6 bushels per acre and on non-irrigated land, 15.2 bushels; winter wheat, 23.7 and 9.3 bushels respectively; spring wheat, 22.8 and 7.4 bushels; oats, 37.0 and 15.2 bushels; barley, 30.8 and 12.5 bushels; rye, 15.5 and 8.6 bushels, and potatoes, 155 and 34 bushels.

IMPOSING PAGEANTRY

MARKS FUNERAL FOR CHINESE PRESIDENT

Peking, March 19.—Imposing pageantry characterized the funeral procession attending removal recently of the body of late ex-President Feng Kuo-chang to the Peking railway station enroute to his native town near Paoli-ting. A large framed portrait of the deceased, and his swords and uniforms were carried in the cortege and his saddle horse which he is said to have ridden at the head of his troops in the siege of Nanking in 1911 followed. The body was carried in a large red cubical structure supported on the shoulders of thirty or more bearers. It was immediately preceded by the four sons and other members of his family and followed by students monks and Taoists.

BRAZIL IS IMMUNE

Rio De Janeiro, March 19.—Thus far Brazil has been immune from the epidemic of influenza that visited North America. Health authorities declare there is no case of the disease in this city now but they are making preparations to cope with it should it appear. Rigid quarantine is being maintained against ships coming from infected ports and several trans-Atlantic liners having influenza cases aboard have been quarantined. School buildings are being transformed into hospitals where patients will be isolated and every effort will be made to stamp out the disease in its beginning.

WORKERS JOIN WITH EMPLOYERS TO BOOST GARMENT PRODUCTION

Cleveland, O., March 19.—To increase production in the women's clothing industry in Cleveland, to eliminate the slack season in the factories and to replace work methods of payment with a weekly wage system, the Cleveland locals of the International Ladies-Garment Workers' Union have joined with manufacturers in employing industrial engineers to a survey of the industry here. The cost of the investigation will be divided equally between the union and the manufacturers.
"This is the first move in this country where organized labor has actually co-operated in bringing about scientific management in industry," Meyer Perlestein, vice president of the international union declared.
It is planned to urge retailers to arrange their orders so as to eliminate as far as possible the rush season in the garment trade and spread the work throughout the year. This, manufacturers declare, should help prevent prices of garments going higher, and even reduce prices if production can be increased sufficiently.
