

KIDDIES HELP TO HUMANIZE THEIR PARKS

Public Recreation Center Improved When Children Were Cared For

New Brunswick, N. J., Oct. 5.—For many years the city of New Brunswick, N. J., has had a pretty park, the gift of a former wealthy citizen, that seemed to supply many civic needs satisfactorily but lacked certain "human" factors that other city parks have. For a long time no one seemed to realize just what this lack was, until finally somebody decided it was because there was not enough attraction there to interest children.

The Sunday Times of New Brunswick took the matter up and through its columns asked for petitions from local children who wanted a playground established in the city park, and the result was an avalanche of names—thousands being sent to the office during the first two weeks.

So a program was planned that called for about \$5,000 worth of equipment and devices. Subscriptions and contributions began to come in and every child who earned a dollar and gave it to the Times for the Playground received a button badge that gives them a life membership in the playground Founders League of New Brunswick. Over a hundred Founders joined before July 4.

One of the principal features under course of construction at this time is a wading pool of concrete, 30 feet across, with a sand "beach" two yards wide all around it. This pool is two feet deep in the center and about two inches deep at the edge, so arranged that the water can flow continuously or be changed every so often by means of convenient valves. When finished, this pool will be one of the finest in the state. The entire project bids fair to create more than an ordinary amount of interest, inasmuch as the movement was practically started and carried out by the children of New Brunswick, and it is seldom, if ever, that so extensive an enterprise has been accomplished in this way.

Even if the complete program is not realized this summer, there is little doubt that next season the city will take the matter up and put it through, as the move is far too popular to die out—indeed, it is very doubtful if the energetic youngsters who are backing the plan would allow it to do so.

BROTHERHOOD OF ST. ANDREW TO HOLD SESSION

St. Louis, Mo., Oct. 5.—Participation in politics as a civic duty and the necessity for curbing the spread of Bolshevism will be stressed at the annual conventions of the Episcopal Brotherhood of St. Andrew and the Junior Brotherhood of St. Andrew, according to delegates there to attend the opening sessions tomorrow.

The question of political activity will be confined to the deliberations of the senior body, according to delegates, and an active campaign against radicalism will be launched through the medium of the Junior Brotherhood. Plans for widening the scope of the organizations also will be considered.

The conventions will end Sunday, with a communion service, several joint sessions being held. Representatives of all sections of the United States and Canada are expected to participate.

Edward H. Bonnell, of Philadelphia, is national president of the Brotherhood.

Among the speakers will be Bishop D. S. Tuttle, St. Louis, presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church in America; Bishop T. F. Gallor, president of the council of the Episcopal church; Dr. John W. Wood, New York, chairman of the department of missions of the Episcopal Church in America; and Rev. James M. Maxon, Nashville, Tenn.

SUPREME COURT OPENS SESSIONS HEAVY CALENDAR

Constitutionality of Suffrage Amendment Expected to Be Decided

Washington, Oct. 4.—The United States Supreme Court reconvened today for its regular term to find a docket crowded with important cases. Besides half a dozen anti-trust suits, matters pending included further attacks on the prohibition amendment, suits against the Eastman Kodak Co. of the anti-profiteering section of the Food Control act and of the Federal Farm Loan Act, appeals in the Newberry election case and many others.

With the federal suffrage amendment ratified and proclaimed since the court adjourned early in the summer, court officials expect that cases designed to test the constitutionality of that amendment also will reach the court during the present session.

The first case to be argued at this term will be government appeals in the dissolution suit against the Lehigh Valley Railroad company, part of the alleged anthracite coal trust. This case is set for tomorrow. By agreement of counsel argument of the other five anti-trust suits will be postponed temporarily. These suits are those against the Eastman Kodak Company, the Associated Bill Posters and Distributors of the United States and Canada; American Can Company, Southern Pacific Company and the Keystone Watch Case Company.

The prohibition amendment will reach the court again through petitions asking for a reconsideration of the decision of last June 7 sustaining the amendment and portions of the enforcement act, rendered in appeals of Christian Fiegenspan, brewer of Newark, N. J., and George C. Dempsey, a Boston liquor wholesaler. A decision on these petitions is expected within a few weeks. A number of

SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY OF AUSTRIA CHARGES PLOT TO RESTORE RULE OF HAPSBURGH TO THE THRONE

Vienna, Oct. 5.—The Social Democratic party of Austria, numerically the largest in the Austrian parliament, charges in an appeal its leaders have issued asking for votes in the election for the National Assembly on October 17 that the counter-revolutionaries have been victorious in Hungary and that their "lynchings and gullotines are preparing the way for restoration in that country of the rule of the Hapsburgs." This is the line of which the late Emperor Francis Joseph and his son Carl were descendants.

"Carl Hapsburg has broken his word and refused to resign the Austrian throne," the socialist aver. "He is to be made King of Hungary in Budapest and from there he is to bring German Austria into subjection. The blood of our peasants and our workers is again to be placed in the service of the Hungarian feudal lords who are arming for war to reconquer Slovakia, Siebenbuergeren and the Banat." The socialists then charge that the Kunschak-Funder group of the Christian Socialist party in Austria is the tool of the Hungarian monarchists.

This appeal and other campaign literature, not only of the Socialist groups but the Conservatives as well, cleverly continues the agitation for union with Germany. "From the day of our breakdown" it says, "we social Democrats have said German Austria alone cannot be a living state. Economic misery will be our lot so long as union with Germany does not free us."

It blames France for preventing this end but declares that the history of the Czechs, the Poles and Jugoslavs proves that a people finally achieves its own right of self-determination in spite of all opposition and all obstacles if only it remains firm in its desire.

The Social Democrats put forward as their issues the reforms they have advocated since the formation of the republic and which they assert have been defeated by the combined bourgeois opposition. In the main these are suppression of the power of the clericals, taxation of capital and great estates, age and invalid insurance, school reforms including separation of schools and church, adequate pay for public servants, and similar measures.

other cases involving interpretations of the enforcement act still are pending and further decisions amplifying the court's original opinion are looked for at this term.

Other cases of consequence before the court are those involving the constitutionality of provisions in the 1919 war revenue act, levying an excise tax on profits derived from child labor; the boundary dispute between Oklahoma and Texas and the case of the United Shoe Machinery Company which comes up from proceedings originally instituted by the government in St. Louis under the Clayton act.


