


# WHAT N. P. LEAGUE HAS DONE

LIBERTY MEMORIAL BUILDING




This splendid Memorial to service men who fell on Flanders' Fields is nearing partial completion. Its total completion and equipment is delayed because the Cass county delegation headed by L. L. Twichell, speaker of the House slashed the appropriation introduced by the Burleigh County delegation several thousands. More than \$100,000 was cut from the appropriation by the I. V. A. majority in the House after the Senate had agreed to give the Historical Society enough to complete this handsome tribute to North Dakota soldiers. Twichell took the floor to fight this appropriation, as he did every measure that contemplated investment by the state at any Missouri Slope point.

The Bank of North Dakota brings more visitors to Bismarck and has as large a payroll as any industry in the city, if not the largest.


Do you wish to see this big asset lost to the city of Bismarck?

A mill at Grand Forks, a rural credit bank at Fargo and a mill at Drake is the "Farmers' Program," they declare.

STATE PENITENTIARY



Site of the proposed State Utility Plant to consolidate the electric plants at the Penitentiary and State Capitol. Plans are almost ready to proceed under the bill passed at the recent session to provide a state electric and steam plant at the penitentiary. This plant would cut down overhead expense by making one plant do the work now done by two plants. It is proposed to furnish juice to run the street car, and for a white way along the scenic road to the bridge, to the state capitol, to Mandan and to the state penitentiary and to the Reform School and State Experimental Farm at Mandan.

Harry Goddard, I. V. A. manager of Burleigh county I. V. A. campaign, is a henchman of E. A. Hughes, owner of the Hughes Electric Light Plant. Goddard, in league with Cass county delegates, lobbied vigorously against the bill creating this plant last winter. The interests he represents are interests close to Hughes. Hughes is against this plant because it will furnish power to industries and for street lighting. It will demonstrate how cheaply power can be produced in the center of the lignite belt. Mr. Voter, can you sense why Harry Goddard is in the fight? If the recall wins, there will be no consolidation of the plants and no white way to Mandan. Harry Goddard and the Fargo bosses whom he is aligned with will see to that. A state plant may furnish cheap juice in time to towns within a radius of 150 miles.
