The last quarter greatly increased the high school lead, and added only one basket to the Alumni count.

Burke and Brown were the high point getters for the high school, while the Alumni counters were rather evenly divided. The contest should help to put the high school team in good shape for next Friday, when the Jamestown quintet will be encountered on the local floor. This game will be a good test of the team's worth, as stiff opposition is expected.
