### BOTHA'S REFUSAL IMPORTANT

War in China Gives Boer's a Chance—Surrender in Squads.

London, March 21.—The Westminster Gazette this afternoon makes pessimistic comment on General Botha's refusal to accept the peace terms offered by General Kitchener and connects this refusal with the situation in China. The Gazette says the powers are at sixes and sevens in the far East and any day may see the commencement of a struggle from which the Boers may recover their own. The failure of these peace negotiations means that the military positions in South Africa is not yet decisive.

London, March 21.—An Exchange telegram says it is understood at Cape Town that negotiations between Kitchener and Botha for the surrender of the burghers were broken off through the attitude of the irreconcilables among the Boers. Botha, however, is inducing his men to surrender in batches. They are encamped at Middleburg, Transvaal, which place is dominated by the British.
