DYNAMITE ON THE TRACK.

Attempt Made to Blow up a Santa Fe Train at Brenham.

Brenham, Tex., Nov. 25.—An attempt was made to blow up the north-bound passenger train on the Santa Fe last night. At 11:30 as a business man was going to his home in the western part of town he discovered a large stick of dynamite placed on the track at the Main street crossing. The gentleman who made the discovery allowed the explosive to remain undisturbed, reported the affair to some other persons, who returned to the place in a few minutes and removed it. The passenger train from Galveston bound north was due to arrive in seventeen minutes. Those who saw the dynamite say it was enough to have blown the locomotive and everybody on it into atoms. To conceal the explosive as much as possible the face of the red light that is stationed at that particular place was turned north when it should have been facing south. This of itself might have caused an unspeakable disaster, as the south-bound through freight train, due here also about that hour, thinking the track clear, would have dashed into the northbound passenger if it had not been running on schedule.

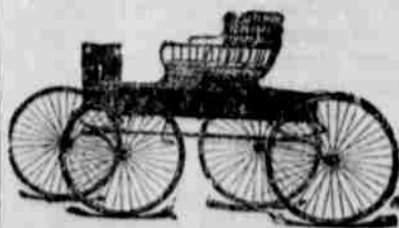
