BLOODY WORK OF DESPERADOES NEAR ANADAPKO.

Sheriff Frank Smith and Deputy Geo Beck Meet Wiss Instant Death While in Discharge of Their Duty-Posse in Pursuit.

T., Jan. 11 .- Information reached here this norning of the killing of Sheriff Frank Smith and Deputy George Beck at Anadarko in the report, which reached here, stated that three men named Miller had held up and robbed some one at Anadarko the night before. The matter was reported to the sheriff, who with the depuford. > It is reported here that a farmer. who was entering the town of Anadarko, Tuesday night, was held up and robbed by three men. The matter was at once referred to . criff Smith, who at once set to work on the case with four deputies.

Early yesterday morning he struck the trail of the robbers and traced them to the home of an old Indian named Two Hatchets, three Iniles outheast of Fort Cabb.

Bloodhounds from Wichita, Kan, are at Rush Springs ready to be put upon the first trail of the men. As so many people have been to the scene of the fight it was thought useless to take the hounds there. It is reported that the sheriff of Cooke county was left Gainesville and is coming this way with hounds.
