MAIL CLERK ARRESTED.

Held to the United States Grand Jury Charged With Embezzling.

Waco, Texas, Feb. 12.—John M. Dennis, a railway mail clerk on the Cotton Belt railway, whose run was between Texarkana and Greenville, was bound over by United States Commissioner McCormick today in the sum of \$1250. He is charged with embezzling two mail packages which are said to have contained \$120. The money was being sent from Oage to the Waco postoffice, it being the government depository for this section of the State. Dennis turned in the packages, 11 in number, when 13 were in his possession.
