Crack British Dragon Regiment Cut to Pieces at Klipsdam.

London, Feb. 20.-A detachment of the Scota Grays (second dragoons.) one of Great Britain's crack drafoons regiments has been cut by the Boers at Klipdam. Bajor C. W. M. Fleiden Santa Fe depot. and Capt. E. Ussher were severely wounded. Two men were killed, six wounded and forty-six captured.
