

NEELY WILL BE FREE.

Offenses Committed by Americans in Cuba Will Be Expatriated. Havana, Cuba, June 11.—President of the Cuban republic today signed the amnesty act, pardoning all Americans, and expatriating their offenses committed in Cuba.

Seely and Rathbone, the postal convicts, will be released tomorrow morning; but Rathbone, the man convicted, hesitates to accept freedom, declaring that nothing but acquittal is sufficient or acceptable to him.

A mob of Cuban paupers besieged the palace today, crying for bread. President Palma took \$1,000 from his private purse and purchased bread for the crowd. Thus the heartless president is showing people his regard for their welfare.

A water famine is also threatened, owing to the bursting this morning of an aqueduct which supplies the water part of the city with water. Plans to repair the break are being made, and it is hoped that it will be immediately repaired.

LAWTON'S GAS WELL.

Very Strong Flow at the Oklahoma Wonder.

Lawton, Ok., June 11.—A strong flow of gas has been struck in a well one mile northeast of this city. The flow of gas was so strong that it was with great difficulty that the well could be plugged up. A plug made from cottonwood was finally driven into the pipe, and so strong is the pressure that the gas is forced through the grain of the wood.

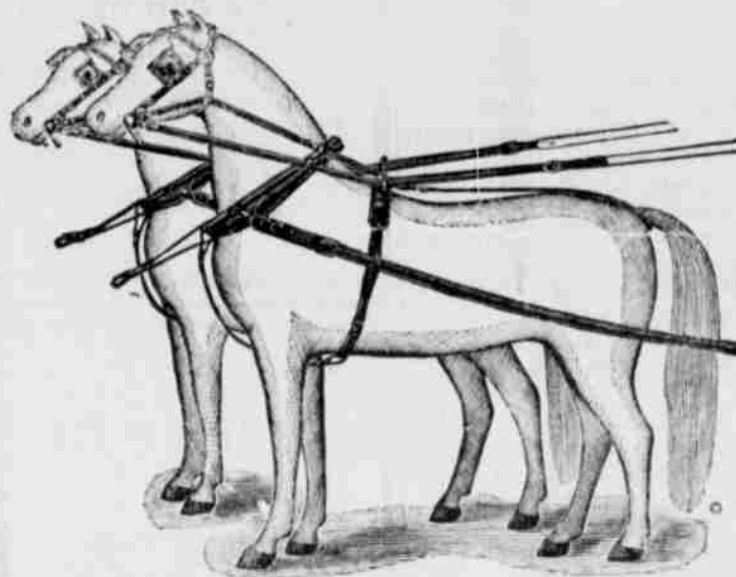
