

AMERICANIZATION OF MEXICO.

Mountains Overrun With Prospectors from the United States.

Within the next ten years agricultural industries in the republic of Mexico will produce greater profits than her mines of silver and gold and her smelters combined. During the past few years over \$500,000,000 of American capital has been invested in the republic and this figure will be greatly exceeded in the next five years. Mexico's mountains and hills are overrun with prospectors from the states; the valleys and hot lands are being invaded by an army which represents many millions of foreign capital, and her resources are being subjected to rigid inspection by men who stand ready to spend vast sums in developing them. The Mexico of twenty, even ten years ago, is gone to return no more, and the awakening of a nation is being accomplished by an inpouring of foreign capital in a rapidly increasing volume.

Holdenville as a Fur Market.

One has naturally learned to include cotton, corn, garden produce, hay, wood, stone and cattle as among the wealth yielding resources of this locality, but fur is seldom looked upon as an important factor in local commerce. In conversation with R. B. Collum, a local fur man recently from Tennessee, some new light was thrown upon the subject of furs as a revenue yielding source at this point.

Mr. Collum bought last week about 1,400 pieces, 15 of which were deer hides. He pays out something like \$500 a week for furs. Last Saturday about \$2,500 worth were shipped from here. The catch of one man, W. H. Neill, amounts to \$129.38 up to the present.

The native furs include coon, opossum, skunk, wild cat, wolf, fox, deer and civet. There is probably a monthly average of \$2,000 paid out for furs marketed here and bought at surrounding towns by local dealers. Conclusion can be arrived at as to the revenue producing value of furs to the people of the Indian Territory.—Holdenville Times.

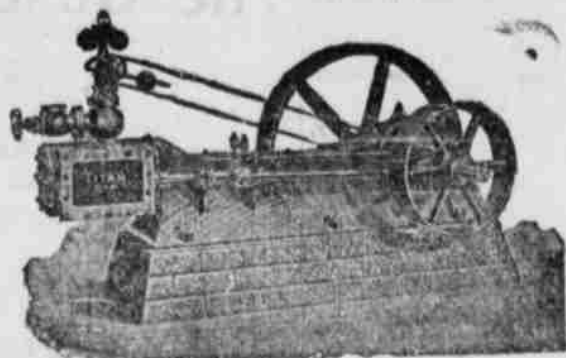

NOTICE IN BANKRUPTCY.

In the United States Court for the Southern District of the Indian Territory. In the matter of J. W. Levine, bankrupt, in bankruptcy. No. 5,263.

To the Honorable Hosea Townsend, Judge of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of the Indian Territory:

J. W. Levine of Ardmore, in the Southern district of the Indian Territory, in said district, respectfully represents that on the 27th day of May, 1902, last past, he was duly adjudged bankrupt under the acts of congress relating to bankruptcy; that he has duly surrendered all his property and rights of property, and has fully complied with all the requirements of said acts and of the orders of the court touching his bankruptcy.
