It is worthy of remark that but for the brightness of the sky the stars could be seen by daylight. Even as matters stand, some of the brighter of them have been seen after sunrise by explorers on high mountains, where the air is very clear and the sky dark blue. If we could go above the atmosphere the sky would appear perfectly black, and stars would be visible right close up to the sun. Astronomers observe bright stars in daytime by using long focus telescopes, the dark tubes of which cut off the side light, and persons in the bottom of deep wells have noticed stars passing overhead, the side light being reduced by the great depth of the wells. THE SUNDAY SCHOOL.

LESSON IV, FIRST QUARTER, INTERNATIONAL SERIES, JAN. 24.

Text of the Lesson, Luke 14: 16-20. Memory Verses, 18, 19—Golden Text, John 1: 12—Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stedman.

Remember, Luke 14: 16-20. "The feast was spread out for many a man of sorrow and acquainted with grief, and he had as it were his face from him. He was despondent and we returned him not." "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came into his own and his own received him not." (John 1: 10, 11). He knew it would be so and yet he came, and became a son of man that we might become sons of God. For as he suffered and died, with him we must die and suffer if we would reign with him (Heb. 12: 18).

Having met the wild beasts and the devil in the wilderness, and having overcome by the word of God, He returned in the power of the Spirit to Capernaum, but not until he returned to where John the Baptist was baptizing, and John had pointed him out as the Lamb of God and Andrew, Simon, Peter and Nathaniel had become his disciples. It is probable also that He changed his name to Jesus of Nazareth, which was the name which He used in His ministry. He was born in Bethlehem, and He was the Son of David and the Son of Abraham, and He was the Son of God.

That He had been brought up at Nazareth would not add to His reputation, for He was from Bethlehem. But all such as this in Nazareth take courage. It is not our environment that makes or makes us new Adam and Eve would never have fallen. The expression "brought up" is sometimes translated "reared" or "nurtured" (Matt. 23: 10; Luke 11: 24; Rev. 12: 6-14) and may suggest in addition to physical growth a nourishing by God with His word and spirit, and a training or education by His providence.

It was His habit to say custom always made in the place of worship on that day, even though the spiritual belief, apart from that derived from the reading of the Scriptures, may have been very small. If the statement implies that it was also His custom to read the Scriptures, then we are increasingly interested to see Him, as a young man, always taking part in the services. As He unfolded the scroll of the prophet Isaiah He found what we call Isa. 61: 1, and He must have read, according to Neh. viii: 8, distinctly, giving the sense and causing them to understand the reading. He read a very brief portion, stopped in the midst of a sentence, folded up the roll, or rolled up the scroll, gave it to the minister, sat down and began to say, "This day is this Scripture fulfilled in your ears" (verse 21). He evidently had no difficulty in finding the place, but this is a matter which is not easy to a good many believers today. As to the portion He read, is it not a complete summary of the glorious gospel of the blessed God? (1 Tim. 1: 11). Glad tidings for the poor, the broken hearted, the captives, the blind, the bruised (Isa. 61: 1, 2; Matt. 9: 13; 11: 27; Ps. cxxxv, 18, 19; Luke viii: 27; 13: 30; xiii: 16; Rev. iii: 17). The acceptable year is still with us—it is still true that "now is the accepted time, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. vi: 2; John 4: 23). The glorious truth is worthy of every one's acceptance that "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1 Tim. 1: 15). As He took His seat all eyes were fastened on Him. Was it because of the way He read, or was it because of what He left unread? Had He read the next sentence He could not have said that it was then fulfilled, for the day of vengeance is not yet. Redemption for Israel and vengeance upon her enemies, so often associated in Scripture, will be at His second coming (Isa. xxxiv: 8; xxxv: 4; xliii: 4; Luke xxi: 24-28; 1 Thess. 1: 7-10). Only the first words of His discourse are given, but as one has said, "It must have been rich in matter and sweet in manner." He was full of grace and truth, full of the Spirit, and it was the Father who spoke through Him (John 1: 14; xii: 49).

He sees the unbelief and enmity in their hearts, and He reminds them that in the days of Elijah and Elisha not many benefited by the teaching or the miraculous powers of God's servants. He knew that Nazareth considered Him Joseph's son and that His townspeople would not receive Him, but it was in the plan that He should thus offer Himself to them.

What great blessing was within the reach of Nazareth that day, but what blindness possessed her! She knew not the time of her visitation. God, the God of Israel, had been in her midst unknown, His glory veiled in human form these many years; and now He reveals Himself as Jesus, their brother, the long foretold Messiah of Israel, but they will not receive Him, for to them He is only "Joseph's son." Oh, how great and all important the question, "What think ye of Christ, whose Son is He?" (Matt. xxii: 42). They would have killed Him, but His hour to die had not yet come and no man could take His life from Him (John 8: 18).

From the time that the devil was told that the seed of the woman would conquer him he ever sought to destroy that seed of the woman, and he has not yet given up the conflict, but "the Lamb shall overcome, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings" (Rev. xvii: 14). He quietly passed through their midst and went down to Capernaum and taught them on the Sabbath days; but while they were astonished at His teaching they did not receive Him (Matt. xii: 23, 24).

TWO SCHOOLS BURN.

Five Hundred Pupils Trained to Fire Drill—Panic in the Other. Kalamazoo, Mich., Jan. 20.—The Kalamazoo street school building burned this afternoon. Five hundred pupils, trained by the fire drill, left the building inside of a minute without accident to one of them.

Dayton, O., Jan. 20.—The Allen school building in North Dayton was gutted today by flames which originated in the basement. The 400 pupils were gotten out in safety with the exception of Edna Baum, a little tottler in the first grade, who was thrown down trampled and fatally injured in the panic. A man at work in the basement is missing and is believed to have burned to death.
