

ON BEHALF OF CITIZENS.

A Bill Providing for Appeal From Citizenship Court.

Washington, Feb. 27.—Mr. Stephens has introduced a bill in the house to provide for an appeal in certain cases from the decision of the citizenship court of the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations. The bill is as follows:

"That there is hereby granted to any person who is claimant for citizenship in the Choctaw or Chickasaw nations in the Indian Territory, claiming right to enrollment and allotment and distribution of tribal property by virtue of a judgment of the United States court in Indian Territory, the act of June 10, 1896, whose right is contested by legal proceedings instituted under the act entitled 'an act to rally and affirm the agreement with the Choctaw and Chickasaw tribes of Indians and for other purposes; a right of appeal to the supreme court of the United States where said judgment has been adverse to them and the supreme court of the United States shall, in said appeal, have upon and decide said case or cases de novo.

"First, As to the legality of the constitution of the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations with regard to the necessity of notices to each of said nations in the proceedings had in said cause as set forth in section 31 of the act of July 2, 1902.

"And said court shall further pass upon and determine as an original question the rights of the several claimants to a trial de novo before said court in the Indian Territory as contended by said nations and set forth in said section 31 of the act of July 2, 1902; and shall further have the right to review, both in law and equity, the decision of said citizenship court as rendered under the terms of said act of July 2, 1902.

"Any person whose property rights are directly affected by the test case provided in said agreement, approved July 2, 1902, may join as a party in said suit without the agreement that the actual amount involved is more than \$5,000 where it is shown that the question is the right of himself, his wife, his wife or his or her minor children to citizenship in said nations.

"All the appellants shall be joined in one suit and the same shall be filed under the authority hereby conferred within three months from date of the passage of this act, and shall be made special and considered by the supreme court at as early a date as is practicable under the rules of said court.

"Service of notice and persons shall be made upon the recognized governors of the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations, respectively, or upon their attorneys of record and upon the parties as provided by law in civil cases. Upon the filing of notice of appeal under the terms of this act the judge and clerk of the citizenship court shall certify under their authority to the clerk of the supreme court of the United States all records under the rules and regulations as now applied to the clerk of the court of appeals of the Indian Territory in cases where appeal is allowed under existing law.

"And upon application of the secretary of the interior, the commissioner of Indian affairs, or the commissioner to the five civilized tribes, or any of their subordinate officers of the United States courts of the Indian Territory, shall furnish certified copies of any records, decisions, regulations or rulings applicable to the said cases for consideration in connection therewith.
