#### Organized Labor at the World's Fair.

The management of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition has provided a most elaborate and attractive program for Monday, September 5, Labor Day. #### May Sell His Land.

The distinction of being the first Indian of blood to have the right to sell his lands is enjoyed by Brooks Wright, a quarter-blood of Wapasha, Choctaw Nation, Indian Agent Shoenfelt yesterday received from Washington an approved application. This is not only the first, but the only application that has met the approval of both the agent and the secretary of the interior.

The land buyers still hang on and daily send petitions that the restrictions upon the sale of lands of full-blood Indians be removed. The agent yesterday transmitted 150 recommendations to Washington asking that that number of applications be approved. The Indian appropriation bill, which contained the provision for the removal of restrictions upon the sale of Indian lands became effective on May 21. A portion of the same section removed the restrictions on all freedmen.
