Texas Turkey Swindle.

Waco, Tex., Nov. 29.—It is now timed by parties here who have got up with the matter that the man sent out agents several days ago buy turkeys and center them at Ardmore for shipment elsewhere and several thousand fowls, probably \$5,000 worth, from the ones who were taken in here and there, and not a cent has been paid the men who furnished the turkeys. Prices paid or to be paid were only 2 cents a pound higher than concerns would pay, and thus the man who had been employed to buy turkeys had no trouble in finding them. The agents were profiting in good faith, but the man manipulated the game is the one badly wanted by the victims.

A contract for delivery called for entering of turkeys in Denison, Tex., and thus checks given in full all came to hand about the time, giving the manipulator a chance to reship the fowls and say, "The territory in which operations were conducted appears to be from Corsicana to Waco and north and south, turkeys having caught in probably a score of places. One man is said to have been manipulated \$1,200 worth of turkeys and another over a thousand is estimated that the total will foot up from \$4,000 to and all have not been heard of."
