HOFFMAN SEEKS REVENGE.

Oklahoma Lawyer Will Return Railroad Passes and Open Campaign.
 Guthrie, O. T., July 29.—Colonel Roy Hoffman of Chandler, one of the leading democratic attorneys of Oklahoma, today announced that he was about to return to the railroad offices all of his passes and begin a campaign against the railroads. Hoffman thinks that the railroads "double crossed" him at the statehood convention at Oklahoma City and that the railroad politicians used influence against him by distributing railroad passes.

"The railroad men in politics are beginning to attract attention," said Colonel Hoffman, "and I believe a campaign against them will be a winning issue."

Hoffman wanted to go to Washington as one of the 29 to represent statehood matters to congress, but was defeated.
