ATTORNEY JOHNSON RETURNS.
 His Visit to Washington was Purely on Business Pertaining to his Office.
 Hon. W. B. Johnson returned today from Washington where he has been for the past two weeks on business. Asked if he was summoned to Washington he said:
 "I was called to Washington by the attorney general to confer about matters pertaining to this district, but not concerning any prosecution growing out of the re-circulation of Chickasaw warrants, nor was the subject mentioned. While there I attended to some business for friends in the treasury and interior department; also in Chicago and St. Louis. I was told at the interior department that the differences with Governor Johnson about the approval of the patents to land had been practically adjusted. This department is over-run with business and many of the officials are away on their annual vacation, so that there will be some delay in all matters which would not otherwise occur.

Washington was awful warm and dull and I was glad to get away. The corn crop is the finest ever known in all the states through which I passed.

"While in Pennsylvania I got some valuable information for the commercial club and I expect Ardmore to be greatly benefited if action is taken at once.

"The prospects for statehood are not considered bright. The Muskegon convention has left the impression that there is discord among our own people and those opposing any kind of statehood will use this to defeat legislation that practically all of our own people want. The argument has always been used in congress that we could not agree on what we wanted. The Muskegon convention will emphasize the argument, just at a time when our prospects were brightest. This is to be deplored by all citizens who hold the welfare of the people above selfish interests.

"You may say that there was no reason for prophesying anything sensational from my trip to Washington. It was made purely on business pertaining to my office and in furtherance of such business. I will return there some time next month.


