MORE CHARGES ON BURTON

SENATOR ACCUSED OF PRESSING INDIAN CLAIMS.

Sefore the Department Reported Fees \$14,000-Used Brothers Name to Hide Personality-Warrants Are in Evidence.

Washington, Aug. 24.-A repor compiled by special agents of the government, which seriously involves United States Senator J. Ralph Burton of Kansas on charges of profiting to the extent of about \$14,000 by pressing Indian claims before the in terior department, was today render ed to the department of justice

The report is the result of the in vestigation that has been in progress for several months into irregularities in manipulating Chickasaw national fund and school warrants in the Chick asaw nation, as a consequence of which several indictments have already been found at Muskogee,

It is understood here that Senator Burton's alleged connection with Chickasaw affairs was discovered when probing into the school warrant The facts set forth in the report

place Senator Burton in a relation to the interior department similar to that in which he acted before the postoffice department when representing the Rialto Grain and Securities Company of St. Louis. In this latter case he was indicted and convicted, though he cause was remanded for a new rial by the supreme court. The sec nd trial is expected to take place in t. Louis next fall.

Senator Burton's conduct in the Sc urites company case and in this new natter which has arisen, is held to be n violation of section 1781 of the Reised Statutes of the United States which makes it a misdemeanor pun shable by a fine of \$10,000 or impris onment for a senator or representative o appear before a government de partment in a case in which the gov rament is interested.

In substance the report puts the de artment of justice in possession of a st of twenty-six Chickasaw national und warrants, which, the report de clares, were issued to Senator Burton and Z. T. Burion for services as at The warrants aggregate torneys: nearly \$14,000. They were all issued during the term of Senator Burton's senatorial service.

Six of the warrants, bearing date of October 22, 1991, it appears, were ssued to J. R. Burton direct and amounted to \$5,500. The others were issued to Z. T. Burton, who, according to the information supplied to the department of justice, was nothing more than the alter ego of Senator Burton. This name is alleged to have been used simply to cover up the part play-

ed by Senator Burton. It is declared that Z. T. Burton had no practice in the Indian eTrritory, and did no actual work before the interior department at Washington. The following is the list of warrants referred to, together with their date
