Southern district of Indian Territory, is in the city on business with the department of justice, Mr. Johnson is originally from Kentucky, and he has the distinction of being one of the live men who organized the Republi can party in Texas, and called the first convention afficen years ago. Speaking of his present home, he said:

"Ardmore, the sent of the court for the Chickness nation, is now the greatest local cotton market of the world, Last year we handled 40,000 bales of cotton, What we need principally in the Indian Territory is in-dustry, but at present, with the re-strictions to prevent the Indians selfing land, no capitalists will go there, for they do not want to rent land. The people in the Territory are inten-sely fond of President Roosevelt, He is just the kind of man that appeals to them.

We have no government there to obtain anything for us, and the railroads have been charging up anything that they pleased. But when he indorsed legislation for controlling their rates he struck the right spot with the residents and won them all the more to his side.

Our country is among the finest in the United States for agricultural purposes Almost anything will grow in he land. Some day, I venture to predict, Indian Territory will be the gar ien of the United States.
