

FARMER JAILED ON GRAND JURY INDICTMENT.

Crop Share is Cause of Trouble—Writer Objected to Renter Paying One-Third of His Crop for Land.

The Fort Worth Record tells us that T. W. Stafford is in the Tarrant county jail awaiting trial. Stafford is a farmer of Webb, who was indicted by the grand jury last Friday on a charge of sending a threatening letter through the United States mail. He was arrested and placed in jail Sunday by Deputy Sheriff W. G. Pritchard.

In the indictment against Stafford the following letter, alleged to have been written by him, is quoted:

"Mr. W. W. Pinyon, Esq.—Dear Sir: I understand you have rented for the third all around. You had just as well rent again. You and that other fellow had just as well quit now. We are going to see you and him don't cultivate it. I have been in that country and find you and that other fellow rented in the same way. You know the sun shines—just that sure we will blow your houses into hell with dynamite. You had better take warning if you all want to live. We mean to do it. We expect to do the same to that widow's houses. We don't want to kill them women and children, but it will be done if they move in the houses. Take warning. This will be done just as certain as the sun shines.

"A FRIEND OF HIS COUNTRY." By the statement, "I understand you have rented for the third all around" is meant that he has rented a farm and intends to pay as rent one-third of the amount realized from the crops raised—corn and cotton. It is the general custom among the farmers who rent to pay only one-fourth of the amount realized for the sale of crops, and it seems that the man signing as "A Friend to His Country," was objecting to the one-third rent, which was more than the farmers are used to paying.

It is alleged that the widow referred to in the communication is a Mrs. Rangland. All parties mentioned are living in the vicinity of Webb. As far as can be learned this is the first indictment of this character ever returned by a grand jury in this county.
