ROOFS COLLAPSE IN LONDON.

At Charing Cross Station and Avenue Theatre—Many Injured.

London, Dec. 5.—One end of the immense roof spanning the Charing Cross main line station collapsed this afternoon, catching a number of workmen and trains.

The roof of Avenue Theatre adjoining, also collapsed, no passengers on train, thirty injured already taken out.

GENERAL STRIKE AT MIDNIGHT.

Unless Sentence of Death is Removed from Sokoloff and Others.

Warsaw, Dec. 5.—The executive committee of Railroad Employees Union has telegraphed to all stations on Russian railroads, urging the men to begin the strike at midnight, unless sentence of death, passed by a court martial at Samara on Sokoloff, an engineer, and on other local leaders, of recent railroad strike at Samara, are reversed.
