### ROBBERY AT DOUGHERTY.

Safe Blown Open and \$700 Secured by Burglars.

Dougherty, I. T., Dec. 6.—(Special.)—The safe in the general merchandise store of Jones & New at this place was blown open at an early hour this morning and the contents, between \$600 and \$700 in money, taken. Nobody here, other than the burglars themselves, heard the report of the explosion.

Two strange men, who have been hanging around the stores for the past few days, are believed to have committed the burglary, as they disappeared last night and have not been seen since. An entrance was effected to the building through the front door and they escaped with the booty through the rear door. The money which they secured was mostly currency, with some gold and silver. Officers are now busily working on the case and blood hounds are expected here this afternoon.

### News at Ardmore.

United States officials were notified this morning that the safe of the firm of Jones and New, merchants at Dougherty had been blown open during the night. It was stated that the sum of \$700 was secured by the burglars. Details of the robbery could not be learned here.

With the information of the robbery deputies were at once dispatched to Dougherty and they will make every effort to locate the guilty party or parties.

It is said that a large portion of the money belonged to various lodges that had the money there for safe keeping.

### Exonerated by Department.

The dispatch printed in the Ardmoreite of yesterday to the effect that the cases against Mansfield, McMurray and Cornish would be dismissed came as no great surprise in Ardmore. At the federal building today the announcement that the department had ordered the cases dismissed was received in a perfunctory sort of way. Although the cases were being prepared for trial it has been understood for some time that the federal officials would be exonerated by the department. So strong was this belief that the matter was accepted as almost a settled fact. In addition to the cases being dismissed against the triba attorneys Gov. Johnston and ex-Gov. Mosely have also been fully exonerated for their alleged connection with Chickasaw funds.

Naturally the friends of Mansfield, McMurray and Cornish were rejoicing today when the story was printed that they have been exonerated. Their friends here have expressed the utmost confidence in the firm, and one leading lawyer said today that he did not believe the firm was guilty of any wrong doing although it may have appeared on the surface that there were irregularities.

The dismissal of the cases is unique proceedings. It is very rare that the department of justice will pass on cases where parties have been indicted but this has been done in the case of Mansfield, McMurray and Cornish and Gov. Johnston and ex-Gov. Mosely indicted for conspiracy to defraud the Chickasaw nation.
