#### Indians are Good Citizens.

"During a recent sojourn in the Indian Territory, I learned that many of the best citizens of that region, people who would never be suspected of being other than white, have more or less Indian blood in their veins," said Mr. J. R. Frank of New Orleans, at the Shoreham.

"I noticed scores of handsome, dressed and beautiful young women on the streets of the more important towns, girls who would be considered attractive in Washington or New York, who were one-sixteenth or perhaps only one-thirty-second of Indian strain. To me they did not convey the slightest appearance of aboriginal descent. Many of them were educated in Eastern cities and in accomplished ranks with their sisters of purest Anglo-Saxon stock.

"Many of the leading business and professional men of that region have married women of mixed blood, and in no cases does such an alliance bring any stigma or social discredit on the white man. The Indian, indeed, considers himself the equal of any, but the women who are partly white greatly prefer white men as matrimonial partners."—Washington Post.
