### WORK OF INCENDIARY.

Tecumseh, O. T., Suffers Second Visitation in a Week.

Shawnee, Ok., Jan. 11.—An incendiary fire, the second in a week, broke out at 5 o'clock this morning in the city of Tecumseh, the county seat of this county.

The fire was first discovered in a frame building just east of the Exchange bank on Washington street.

No fire had been in the building since early the evening before. The fire department responded promptly but was hampered by lack of water. A heavy wind was blowing at the time and, constantly shifting, scattered brands for two blocks in various directions.
