The important land contest of Leslle versus Ebisch, involving valuable property in the Chickasaw nation, has been finally decided by the secretary of the interior. The decision of the commission in this case was reversed before the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and upon appeal to the Secretary, the decision of the Indian office was sustained and the land claimed, by virtue of the improvements thereon, awarded to the contestant, Leslie

The above case is interesting from a legal standpoint by reason of the fact that it raised the interesting question of "Public Domain," as applied to land contests. William W. Wright, of Washington, D. C., represented Mr. Leslie, as counsel, before the Interior department.
