FRIGHTFUL ACCIDENT.

Clark Murphy, Colored, Met Death Under Santa Fe Wheels.

A frightful accident occurred yesterday morning about 7 o'clock when Clark Murphy, aged 21 years, a colored laborer employed by the Santa Fe as a section hand fell under the wheels of a north bound freight train and received injuries which resulted in his death about an hour later. There were no witnesses to the accident, hence it cannot be told exactly how it happened. It is presumed by railroad men that Murphy, while attempting to catch the train missed his footing and fell under the cars. He was horribly crushed about the legs and groin and when picked up by Officer Will Ward was in an unconscious state passing away in that condition in a short time.

Murphy had been at work only a short time for the road. Little is known of his relatives or where he came from. Agent Dunham of the Santa Fe is making efforts to find out where the dead man resided. He boarded at a colored place in North Ardmore, but was a stranger to the occupants. His remains will be buried here tomorrow.

CONFEDERATE REUNION

A Large Attendance Expected at Oklahoma and Indian Territory.

At a conference of the officers of the Confederate Veterans of the territories, which was held in this city a few days ago, at which Gen. W. of Norman, Okla., and Gen. G. of Ardmore, I. T., met Col. Wm. of Gen. Brant Kirk of the S. were in attendance, the Reunion was selected as the official one for New Orleans, La., to the Million Union this spring. This excursion, which a rate of \$1.70 has been secured, will be run from Oklahoma and Ardmore, and the train will be both blue and the gray.

Oklahoma veterans will assemble in Oklahoma City, and will go to the Choctaw, where they will be met at Wilburton, I. T., by the federal veterans who will assemble at more and Wilburton. It is thought fully 2,500 veterans from Oklahoma and Indian Territory will attend. Route selected is to Memphis and the Illinois Central for New Orleans returning via Vicksburg. Miss Floy Mullen of Ardmore, has been selected as the sponsor for the Territory.—Times-Journal
