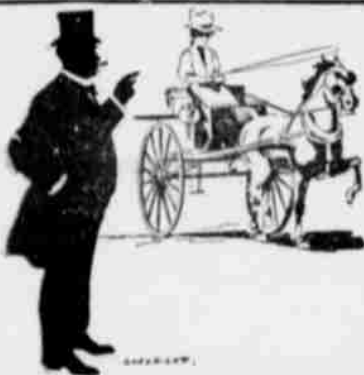

Dubuque, Iowa, Aug. 25.—Thousands of visitors have already arrived to attend the annual encampment of the National German Veterans' society, or Deutscher Krieger Verein, which will be informally opened with a great open air celebration at Shooking Park tomorrow afternoon. An address will

be delivered by President A. F. Fruden and a band concert and fireworks display will be given in the evening. Headquarters of the society were established today in German hall, where a free luncheon is being served to all arriving delegates. The first business session of the encampment will be held Monday morning.

Deaf Mute Educators.

Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 25.—More than 250 delegates from all the states of the Union are in attendance at the convention of the American Association of Deaf Mute Teachers, which opened at Edgewood Park today. Addresses of welcome were delivered by President J. B. Jackson and Superintendent W. N. Burt of the Pennsylvania school for deaf mutes and Congressman John Daize of this city. The convention will last until Friday. Dr. A. L. E. Cronter, superintendent of the Philadelphia Deaf and Dumb Institute, is president of the association. Many prominent educators of deaf mutes will read papers, including Prof. J. Pearson of Halifax, N. S.; J. W. Blattner of Austin, Tex.; Frank Briggs of Salt Lake City, Utah; Dr. A. G. Bell of Washington, and E. M. Goodwin of Morgantown, N. C.
