WE ARE SLEEPING ON OUR POLITICAL RIGHTS.

The national government is spending many millions of dollars to irrigate desert lands in the west. It is true that the money is really lent to the land owners, but the fact that these lands are being irrigated and when irrigated produce fine crops, is advertised all over the world, and people come all the way from Europe to buy the lands at \$25 to \$75 an acre.

Here in Indian Territory we have lands better than those irrigated deserts. Here God has not forgotten to send rain and sunshine for all the centuries. It needs no irrigation, it only needs the plow and hoe to produce better and to produce a better variety than any of that irrigated desert.

A trip through Indian Territory shows how sadly the land needs people, and all through the north, east and west the people need the land. If we are active in our politics, especially in selecting men for congressional seats, we will gain a tremendous advantage.
