**CRIMINAL DOCKET**

FOR THE APRIL TERM HAS BEEN ARRANGED.

**WILL HEAR NO CAPITAL CASES**

A Number of Interesting Misdemeanors Set For Trial Including the Marietta Drowning Case of Embezzlement.

The calendar of the criminal docket for the April term of the U. S.
