WOULD BE MURDERER

W. R. FULTON SHOTS HIS ESTRANGED WIFE.

SHOTS HIMSELF TO DEATH

His Body Found in Railroad Yards Today—Was Chased by a Mob of Infuriated Men Last Night.

Wichita, Kans., May 11.—W. R. Fulton, who last night made an unsuccessful attempt to kill his former wife, shooting her four times, committed suicide this morning by shooting himself, following his escape from an infuriated mob which chased him several blocks.
Fulton's body was found in the railroad yards, four blocks from where he had attacked Mrs. Fulton.
It is not believed that the woman is dangerously wounded.

CLAIMANTS FILES PETITION.

Attorneys for Allison's Ask That They Be Placed on Cherokee Roll—Have Allotment Certificates.

Washington, May 11.—The two firms of attorneys James K. Jones & Son, and Kappeler & Merrill of Washington, representing Ida, John, George, Johnnie and Frankie Allison yesterday filed in the Supreme court of the District of Columbia petitions for writs of mandamus to compel Secretary Garfield to restore them to citizenship in the Cherokee Nation, Secretary Hitchcock having cancelled their enrollment March 4, last.
Judge Wright issued a ruling requiring the secretary to show cause May 17, why he should not be compelled to restore the parties named. All the parties have allotment certificates and the petitions alleged that other parties were being permitted to file on the Allison's allotments. Some of the land has flowing oil wells and action was necessary because the department except where restored by the courts here, holds that the cancellation of Secretary Hitchcock is valid.

RUNS INTO OPEN SWITCH

ONE KILLED AND TWO INJURED IN WRECK AT ALTUS.

ANOTHER BRAKEMAN HURT

Struck by Bridge Expander and His Skull Fractured—Frisco's Hoodoo Division Has Bad Day.

Altus, Okla., May 11.—The extra freight train on the St. Louis and San Francisco railroad ran into an open switch here this morning, and was wrecked. J. E. Conner, a brakeman, was killed and Engineer Spence and Fireman S. E. Wall, fatally injured.
An hour before the wreck happened, J. P. Reed, a brakeman was fatally injured by a bridge expander and suffered a fractured skull.
