## CALL FOR ELECTION.

Democratic Primary Election for Delegates to Congressional County Convention.

By virtue of the action of the Democratic Congressional Committee for the Fifth Congressional District of Oklahoma, a primary election is hereby called for Carter County to be held on June 15th, 1907, in each election precinct in said county for the purpose of electing delegates to the county convention to be held at Ardmore June 19th, 1907, each voting precinct to elect one delegate for every twenty-five votes or major fraction thereof cast for the democratic nominee in the constitutional convention election, November 6, 1906.

## THE VOTING PRECINCTS

IN CARTER COUNTY LOCATED AND MARKED OUT BY BOARD.

## FORTY-TWO IN THE COUNTY

The Geographical Divisions Located as Near Equal as Possible for the Convenience of the Voters.

The labors of the board of county commissioners recently appointed to lay off the city and county into voting precincts were completed Saturday morning. The total number of voting precincts in the county including the city will be 42, of which number nine are in the city.

The officials for the election to be held on August 6, or whenever the regular election is to be held will be named at a subsequent meeting to be held by the board.

The following are the locations of the various voting precincts:

No. 1—That portion of Ward No. 1 in Ardmore lying between Washington Ave and B St., N. W., with voting place at First Baptist church.

No. 2—That portion of Ward 1 in Ardmore lying between B street and E street N. W., with voting place at Keller's store.

No. 3—That portion of Ward 1 in Ardmore lying west of E street, with voting place at West End Wagon yard.

No. 4—That portion of Ward 2 lying between Washington avenue and the Santa Fe railroad and E street, northeast, with voting place at C. P. Hall's store.

No. 5—That portion of Ward 2 in Ardmore not included in precinct No. 4, with voting place at Presbyterian church, 6th avenue northeast.

No. 6—That portion of Ward No. 3 in Ardmore, lying between Washington and D street southwest and F street south of railroad, with voting place at city hall.

No. 7—That portion of Ward No. 3 in Ardmore, not included in Precinct No. 6, with voting place at Porter Staples' store.

No. 8—That portion of Ward No. 4 in Ardmore, lying east of E street southeast, with voting place at Public School building.

No. 9—That portion of Ward No. 4 in Ardmore, west of E street southeast, with voting place at Whittington hotel.

No. 10—S 1/2 of T 4 S, R 3 E which lies in Carter county, with voting place at Wilson.

No. 11—N 1/2 of T 5 S, R 3 E which lies in Carter county; also sections 29 to 32 inclusive, T 4 S, R 3 E with voting place at Providence.

No. 12—S 1/2 of T 4 S, R 3 E, except section 19, 20, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 35, with voting place at Darwood.

No. 13—N 1/2 T 4 S, R 1 E; also sections 19 and 20 in said township, with voting place at Mulkey.

No. 14—E 1/2 T 3 S, R 3 E, with voting place at Baum.

No. 15—W 1/2 T 3 S, R 3 E; also strip 2 miles wide by 6 miles north and south, on east side of T 3 S, R 1 E; also the fractional part of T 2 S, R 2 E, east of the section line between sections 22 and 24, 25 and 27, 34 and 35, in said T 2 S, R 2 E, with voting place at Berwyn.

No. 16—All of T 3 S, 2 E, except strip 2 miles wide on east side included in Precinct No. 15; also 2 mile strip off east side T 3 S, R 1 E; also 2 mile strip off east side T 2 S, R 1 E; also remaining part of T 2 S, 2 E which lies in Carter county, except 2 mile strip on east side of said township, with voting place at Springer.

No. 17—Commencing SE corner Sec. 34, T 3 S, R 1 E; thence north 9 miles to county boundary; thence west 4 miles to Indian meridian; thence south to intersection with Caddo creek; thence east following center of Caddo creek to where section line between sections 20 and 21, T 3 S, R 1 E, crosses said creek; thence south to southeast corner Sec. 32, T 3 S, R 1 E; thence east to point at beginning; with voting place at Glen.

No. 18—Commencing southeast corner Sec. 32, T 3 S, R 1 E; thence north to Caddo creek; thence westwardly following meanderings of Caddo creek to where section line between Secs. 15 and 16 crosses said creek; thence south to township line; thence east along said township to point at beginning, with voting place at Newport.

No. 19—Commencing where township line between T 1 E and T 1 V crosses Caddo creek; thence westwardly following meanderings of Caddo creek to where said creek intersects section line between Secs. 15 and 16, T 3 S, R 1 west; thence
