New Compress at Chickasha.

Chickasha, I. T., June 20.—Five car loads of machinery for the new cotton compress has just been received here, also twenty cars of other material, and work is being pushed rapidly. The old compress was destroyed by fire several months ago, the loss being about \$1,000,000. The new compress will occupy the same site and be larger and better than the one burned.

WILL DRILL AT CADDO.

Drilling Machinery Ordered and Search for Oil Will Begin.

Caddo, I. T., June 20.—It is stated by a director of the Caddo Oil and Gas Company that the drilling machinery, which is a standard rig, has been received by the oil company and a derrick will be erected and machinery placed at once for boring for oil in this section of the country. This company is financed by Caddo people, with others from Texas, California and Indian Territory. This field has been recently visited by oil experts from California and other oil fields and is pronounced by all to be the best undeveloped field that they have seen. On several of the farms on which the company has leases oil has been struck at a depth of from 75 to 150 feet. These wells were not down for the purpose of securing water, but owing to the flow of oil have been abandoned for that purpose. The Texas pipe line runs through the heart of 8,000,000 acres of the company's leases.

KILLING AT MILL CREEK

A. B. English, Known as "Bud," Shot and Killed in a Pool Hall Brawl. Two Balls Taking Effect in Region of the Heart.

Mill Creek, I. T., June 20.—In an altercation in the pool hall here yesterday afternoon A. B. English, commonly known as "Bud," was shot and killed, two balls entering his body in the region of the heart.

Details as to the killing are missing. H. T. Moore, formerly city marshal, is alleged to have fired the shots that took fatal effect.

Parties coming in today at noon on the southbound Santa Fe report that Bud English and Bud Moore, two citizens of Mill Creek, became involved in a difficulty yesterday afternoon in that city, and as a result Bud English was killed, having been shot through the heart. Bud had been existing between the two men for the past several years and when they met yesterday English opened up on Moore by taking a fancy shot at him and Moore retaliated by putting English to sleep. From what can be learned English was considered a dangerous man and has been in several difficulties.

Moore is a brother-in-law to police officer Arch Campbell.

Moore, together with his witnesses went to Tahomah to stand the preliminary hearing to be held in that city today.

MAY CONTEST IN COURT.

Defeated Candidate for Insurance Commissioner Makes Demand.

Guthrie, Ok., June 20.—John D. Burke of Guthrie, who was defeated by J. T. McComb at Oklahoma City for the nomination of State Insurance Commissioner in the recent Democratic primaries by 2,400 votes, today issued the following demand to Chairman Felix Adler and Secretary E. F. Rhine of the Logan County Democratic committee:

"Gentlemen—This is to notify you that if the election returns of the primary election, held in Logan county on June 8, 1907, are not certified to the state central committee on or before June 26, 1907, I will ask for an order of court to compel you to do so."

Because the election officers of Logan county refused to swear to the returns from the Logan county, the returns were refused by the state canvassing board and did not figure in the canvassing of the votes. Burke holds that with the majority he received in this county, he would be nominated over McComb and will contest the nomination on that ground.

Guthrie—Cy Howenstein, local manager in Custer county of Gov. Frantz' campaign for renomination, has fallen throughout this at Arapaho to succeed J. W. Lawson, whose second term expired a year ago.

Guthrie—Beginning last night, a heavy rain has fallen throughout this portion of Oklahoma. While cotton and corn are benefited, yet many farmers have their alfalfa crop down and much damage will result.

Lawton—At a meeting of the Chamber of Commerce last night the proposition of H. S. McGowan for the erection was accepted and a committee appointed to raise the \$5,000 bonus asked.

Shawnee—Miss Willie Irene Stone and John H. Wright were united in marriage at the home of the bride in this city this afternoon at 2 o'clock by Rev. J. L. Bray. They left immediately after the ceremony for an extended tour of the East. They will reside at Oklahoma City.

Guthrie—After eating a large quantity of fruit, including many plums, which she ate seeds and all, Ruth White, the 19 year old daughter of Mock Holman of Ada, was found unconscious under the plum tree and died within a few hours. The plum seeds caused her death.

Ryan—The county congressional convention for Jefferson county met at this place today and elected delegates to cast the county vote at the meeting at Hobart. The delegates were instructed to cast their vote for Claude Weaver of Pauls Valley for congressman from the Fifth district. Weaver won out in the convention by a very close margin. Buford Bond of Chickasha being a close second.
