CARTER COUNTY PRECINCTS WHERE ELECTIONS ARE HELD

Election Notice.

The following is a description of the election precincts into which the municipal townships of Carter County, Oklahoma, have been divided and established by the Board of County Commissioners of said County, at a meeting held upon the 15th day of August, A. D., 1907, showing the designated place of holding the election in each of said precincts, with the name of the inspector appointed for the purpose of conducting the election to be held September 17, 1907, in each precinct, to-wit:

Ardmore Township No. 1. Said township is hereby divided into nine election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1. That portion of Ward No. 1, in Ardmore, lying between Washington avenue and B street, N. W., with voting place at First Baptist church and D. E. Booker is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 2. That portion of Ward No. 1, in Ardmore, lying between B street, N. W., and E street, N. W., with voting place at Keller's store and A. C. Bagby is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 3. That portion of Ward No. 1, in Ardmore, lying west of E street, N. W., with voting place at West End Wagon Yard, and Frank Kolb is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 4. That portion of Ward No. 2, lying between Washington street and Santa Fe R. R. and Santa Fe R. R. and E street, N. E., with voting place at C. P. Hall's store, Caddo street, N. E., and W. F. Freeman is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 5. That portion of Ward No. 2, in Ardmore, not included in Precinct No. 4, with voting place at Presbyterian church, 6th Ave., N. E., and Errett Dunlap is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 6. That portion of Ward No. 3, in Ardmore, not included between Washington street and D street, S. W. and F street, south of railroad, with voting place at City Hall, and Harold Wallace is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 7. That portion of Ward No. 3, in Ardmore, not included in Precinct No. 6, with voting place at Porter Staples' store and Hal Cannon is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 8. That portion of Ward No. 4 in Ardmore, lying east of E street, S. E., with voting place at Public School Building, and C. H. Cook is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 9. That portion of Ward No. 4, in Ardmore, west of E street, S. E., with voting place at Whittington Hotel, and J. L. Dasher is hereby appointed inspector.

Morgan Township No. 2. Said Morgan Township No. 2 is hereby divided into five election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1. West one-half of township five, south range one east; also sections five to eight, inclusive, seventeen to twenty, inclusive; twenty-nine to thirty-three, inclusive; township four south, range one east, with voting place at the school house at Brock, and Ivy Coffee is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 2. South half of township five south, range two east, excepting sections twenty-three and twenty-four, with voting place at the school house in Hoobar, and T. W. Denham is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 3. North one-half of township five south, range two east, and sections twenty-three and twenty-four in said township, with voting place at Concord school house, and C. W. Thomas is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 4. All of township four south, range two east, except that within corporate limits of Ardmore; also that portion of section thirty-one, lying outside corporate limits of Ardmore; also sections one and two, township four south, range one east, with the voting place at Chickasaw Lake Club House and W. T. Simmons is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 5. East 1/2 of township five south, range one east; also that portion of section thirty-one, township four south, range two east, not included in corporate limits of Ardmore; also sections thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, township four south, range one east, with voting place at Downard Asphalt Mines in the Pleasant Hill school house, and C. H. Duncan is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 6. Sections three, four, nine to sixteen, inclusive, twenty-one to twenty-eight, inclusive, township four south, range one east, except that part of section twenty-five within the corporate limits of Ardmore, with voting place at Uncle Jack's store, and O. L. Lasley is hereby appointed inspector.

Wilson Township No. 3. Said Wilson Township No. 3 is hereby divided into four election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1. South half of township five south, range three east, which lies in Carter County, with voting place at W. P. Polard's store-house at Wilson, and C. L. Ford is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 2. North one-half of township five south, range three east, which lies in Carter County; also sections twenty-nine to thirty-two inclusive, township four south, range three east, with voting place at the school house at Provence, and J. E. Bowling is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 3. The south one-half of township four south, range three east, except sections nineteen, twenty, twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three and thirty-four, with voting place at the school house at Durwood, and Frank Ramsey is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 4. North one-half of township four south, range three east; also sections nineteen and twenty in said township, with voting place at Mulkey's store at Mulkey, and D. W. Dunn is hereby appointed inspector.

Berwyn Township No. 4. Said Berwyn Township No. 4 is hereby divided into three election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1. East one-half of township three, south, range three east, with voting place at John Thomas' store house at Baum, and John Thomas is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 2. West one-half of township three south, range three east; also strip two miles wide by six miles north and south on east side of township three south, range two east; also the fractional part of township two south, range two east, east of the section line between sections twenty-two and twenty-three, twenty-six and twenty-seven, thirty-four and thirty-five, in said township two south, range two east, with voting place at Berwyn, at George Murray's iron building, and G. T. Fisher is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 3. All of township three south, range two east, except strip two miles wide on east side, included in Precinct No. 2; also two mile strip off east side township three south, range one east; also two mile strip off east side township two south range one east; also remaining part of township two south, range two east, which lies in Carter county, except two mile strip on east side of said township, with voting place at Patton's store house at Springer, and W. W. Mahuren is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 4. West one-half of township three south, range one west; also west one-half of township two south, range one west, with voting place at the school house at Milo, and W. A. Taliaferro is hereby appointed inspector.

Graham Township No. 6. Said Graham Township No. 6 is hereby divided into six election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1. North one-half of township one south, range two west, with voting place at the school house at Homer, and R. Ross is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 2. South half of township one south, range two west, and north one-half township two south, range two west, with voting place at the school house at Elk, and W. T. Majors is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 3. Township two south, range three west, and the north one-half of township three south, range three west, with voting place at the school house at Fox, and T. H. Carpenter is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 4. South one-half of township two south, range two west, with voting place at the school house and the north one-half of township three south, range two west at Graham, and O. L. Bounds is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 5. The west one-half of township one south, range three west, with voting place at Hewitt's store at Tussy, and W. H. Steagall is hereby appointed inspector.

Precinct No. 6. The east one-half of township one south, range three west, with voting place at the school house at Monk, and John Forehand is hereby appointed inspector.

Hewitt Township No. 7. Said Hewitt Township No. 7 is hereby divided into eight election precincts, described as follows, to-wit: Precinct No. 1.
