WORK OF CITY COUNCIL

(Continued from Page One)

Madden made a speech to the council asking the city fathers to give them a cleaner Ardmore.

Just at this time Mrs. Kendall, who represented the Benevolent society, called upon the council to assist the society in paying the bills incurred in assisting the poor and needy of the city.

On account of the date of setting by the court the order to issue the refunding bonds of the city in the sum of \$71,000 was passed again and will be dated February 15.

The following monthly reports were read and received:

George H. Bruce, city clerk, water and sewer revenue collected for the month ending January 31:

To amount water revenue col-lected \$4,701.68. To amount sewer revenue col-lected 717.35.

Total \$2,418.43. Police Judge J. L. Galt, during the month of January 115 cases were tried and \$676.00 collected in fines.

R. S. Hayden, city tax assessor and collector:

General fund \$1,863.06. Occupation 213.00. School fund 1,528.36. Penalty 13.75. Improvement district No. 1 11,932.28. Street and alley fund 917.07. Interest fund 909.83. Sinking fund 909.81. Cemetery 35.00.

Total \$18,422.29.

Street Tax Collector M. Ikard made the following complete report:

As you did not seem to understand my last report, I hereby submit my report from the beginning of my work August 24, to the present time.

Number of men paid in August and September 399; collected \$170.00.

Bank receipts, \$1103.00. October paid in \$600; bank receipts \$528.40.

November and December 114 paid in \$312.00; bank deposits, \$312.50.

January 67 paid in \$201.00; bank deposits \$167.15.

Commission on first \$1500 collected at ten per cent, \$150.

Commission on remainder at fifteen per cent, \$129.95.

Total amount collected \$2313.00. Total deposited in bank \$2041.05. Total commission, \$271.95.

I have filed 289 complaints for failure to work the streets.

Alderman Shelton of the improvement committee, announced that the contract for piping the city hall for natural gas had been let to Holman & Best, that firm being the lowest bidder.

The fire committee, together with the mayor and chief of the department, received authority to purchase the necessary equipment to put the department on an adequate basis with which to fight fires.

Alderman Cruce announced that the street gang under the supervision of Commissioner Moore was doing a good work in grading the streets and should be complimented.

Dairymen L. West, through Alderman Cruce, wants to be reimbursed for paying out money in water rents for the laying of pipe to his place.

The matter was referred to the water works committee.

Alderman Carpenter of the cemetery committee, reported that the sexton at the cemetery wants the city to furnish him with fuel. Referred.

The improvement committee was ordered to notify the chain gang and street force to do the necessary work on the campuses of the school buildings in the Second and Fourth wards to beautify same as per the request of the ladies clubs in those wards.

Alderman Pennington wanted a settlement had with the street and alley tax collector, M. Ikard, on the basis that the collector was to receive five per cent for the first thousand collected, ten per cent for the second thousand and fifteen per cent for the remainder, and not as the collector had reported, ten and fifteen per cent.

About 70 claims were audited and ordered paid.

The city clerk was ordered to transfer the school fund from the general fund to the school treasury.
