PULITZER SLANDER SUIT IS WITHOUT PRECEDENT

Washington, Jan. 16.—Six Washington correspondents of out-of-town papers and a local newsboy today received subpoenas to appear next week before the federal grand jury and give testimony, presumably in connection with statements appearing in their publications bearing on the Panama canal purchase. So far as it has been possible to ascertain these were the only ones cited: Otto Carmichael, Charles S. Albert and E. Jesse Conway, all of the New York World staff; James Hornaday of the Indianapolis News; Jeremiah Matthews of the New York Sun; Harry M. Crist of the Brooklyn Eagle and William Smith, a newsboy of Washington engaged in selling New York papers.

With the exception of Mr. Crist, who is commanded to go to New York and present himself Monday morning before the grand jury of the circuit court for the Southern district, the persons are directed to appear before the federal grand jury of the District of Columbia next Tuesday morning. The World staff also were directed to bring with them files of the papers for September, October, November and December, 1908, "in the case of the United States vs. Press Publishing company," publishers of the New York World. All when interviewed declared they were wholly ignorant of the nature of the case regarding which they were called on to testify.

There is no doubt here that the subpoenas all have to do with a suit for libel which it is believed has been brought by the government in New York against the World. It was the publisher of the World and the publisher of the Indianapolis News, Messrs. Joseph Pulitzer and Delavan Smith, whom the President, in a letter dated Dec. 1 last, to William Dudley Foulke in response to one from him, severely denounced, and in his special message to Congress of Dec. 15 regarding the charges of corruption by or on behalf of the government in the matter of the canal purchase the President announced that the attorney general had under consideration the form in which proceedings for libel against Mr. Pulitzer should be brought.

Nowhere in the annals of the government has such action been taken as the United States government suing for criminal libel. The President in his message was most emphatic in saying that it should not be left to a private citizen to enter the suit and he was particularly emphatic that he did not believe "we should concern ourselves with the private individuals who wrote the lying and libelous articles, articles from the columns of the real offender, Joseph Pulitzer, editor and proprietor of the World."

It is therefore inferred that the correspondents were summoned as witnesses and not with the ultimate idea of making them co-defendants. As soon as the subpoena was served upon Mr. Carmichael he got in touch with his office in New York and left on an afternoon train for that city, where he will hold a conference with his superior officers.

"I don't know what it is about," said Mr. Carmichael before leaving, "and I have had no information from the office about the matter."

That every effort was made to prevent any "leak" in New York before the subpoenas were served is evidenced by the fact that Mr. Crist's subpoena was directed to "John" Crist, the indictment later being written upon it that "John" was a fictitious name.

A LUCKLESS WOMAN. Loses Property in Two Fires and is Now Penniless. Muskogee, Okla., Jan. 17.—Aroused in the early morning hours by the alarm of fire, her exit from the third-story apartment by means of the fire escape cut off by the devouring flames, Mrs. George Brown carried to safety in her night clothes in the arms of a fireman, was probably the heaviest loser in the recent disastrous fire which destroyed \$200,000 worth of Muskogee business property.

Her loss was by odds much less in the aggregate than that of others, but relatively greater, as the sum total of her present possessions is her night apparel in which she was carried from the burning apartment. Lying pitifully near the verge of nervous collapse at the home of a friend, Mrs. Brown recalls a similar misfortune experienced during the San Francisco disaster of three years ago, from which she, formerly a woman of wealth, emerged with scanty apparel and meager resources.

In the San Francisco conflagration Mrs. Brown's extensive ready hold-ings were destroyed and the bank in which her funds were deposited also met a like fate. Coming here recently to visit her brother, Mrs. Brown's possessions consisted mainly of a few priceless diamonds and several family heirlooms, among them a rare Stradivarius violin, all of which were lost in the recent conflagration which came near destroying the life of the luckless woman.

Trouble at Muskogee. Suits by Owners of Small Buildings Wrecked During Fire. Muskogee, Okla., Jan. 17.—Because the fire chief, during the recent disastrous fire which destroyed \$200,000 worth of city business property, as a precautionary measure to prevent the further spreading of the flames ordered the demolition of several small one-story frame buildings adjacent to the main block.
