## THE TARIFF SCHEDULES: A PUBLIC UPRISING EXPECTED

Washington, March 25.—Those who are on the inside of the tariff question and are well versed in the provisions contained in the Payne measure, are looking for a national uprising and general political chaos when some of the tariff schedules are thoroughly understood by the long-suffering American public. For instance a careful perusal of the schedules will disclose such startling facts as these:

Dividiv is on the free list, Dragon's blood is likewise free; gambler is relieved from the necessity of paying any duty; benzaldehyde, benzedin and colidin are among the necessities of life that escape without a tax; and as for cereum, reserain and coculus indicus, they also avoid the imposition of a tariff.

This, however, is not all. It will be found on careful study of the bill that balm of gilead can be imported into the United States free of duty, and annatto, roucou, rocoa and ortans and all the extracts thereof, will be allowed the same privilege.

It is generally expected about the capitol that this feature of the bill will excite wide, wild and heartfelt discussion. Members from the various districts are expected, while the general debate season is on, to devote a great deal of attention to this

schedule and it is not improbable that political fortunes will be staked and lost on the issue of what shall happen to roucou.

And then there is a paragraph which provides that nyrobolans shall be on the free list. No doubt this will meet with much opposition. There is also a paragraph leaving unprotected such infant industries as cummin, fennel, fenugreek, mango-wortel, St. John's bread and coriander.

After much deliberation and worry the ways and means committee finally decided to put on the free list iridium, osmium, palladium, rhodium and ruthenium.

Some ten- and apprehension is expressed lest this action of the committee prove to be unsatisfactory to the manufacturers of these products in the United States. Reports are current that a combination may be formed between the interests that will be affected by putting ruthenium on the free list and those that have been hard hit by the cutting in half of the duty on lumber. It is conceded a combination of this sort would be well nigh irresistible.

No doubt the country would survive these things, but it is to be noted by paragraph 559 of the tariff measure that kieserite is going to be admitted

to the country without charge. And those in search of "jokers" in the handicraft of Hon. Seneca Payne will not fail to discern on microscopic inspection that "hones, whetstones and hoofs, unmanufactured" are going to go in under the tariff walls and not pay a cent of revenue to the dwindling treasury.

As if such things as those mentioned were not enough to arouse a tempest of indignation in the mind of the plain, every day citizen who is bent on getting his rights, what must be think when he discovers that arack, ratafia, and kirchswasser are going to be compelled to pay \$2.25 per gallon.

Probably the thing above all that will make the ire of the honest American rise up will be when he finds that "spunk" is on the free list. The committee is understood to feel that the native supply is inadequate and large importations of the foreign product are expected if this provision (escapes the eagle eye of Hon. Nelson Wilmarth Aldrich, boss of the upper house.

**WIFE IS A "HOLY JUMPER"**  
MUSKOGEE COUNTY FARMER FILES SUIT FOR DIVORCE—BELIEVES IN FREE LOVE.

Muskogee, Mar. 24.—Alleging that his wife has eloped with John Miller, leader of a free love sect of religionists styling themselves as "Holy Jumpers," and who have been making converts in Oklahoma during the past year, C. E. Lane, a Muskogee county farmer, today filed suit in the district court asking for divorce from Ardilla Lane, his wife.

The couple were married in Bartlesville in 1903 and have no children. Declaring she loved Miller better than any other man, Lane says his wife first went with Lane, to Coffeyville, Kansas and later left for California.

The plaintiff alleges in his petition that he lived happily with his wife until she allied herself with the licentious sect, of "Holy Jumpers" and became infatuated with Miller.

**To Build Plant Near Tulsa.**  
Tulsa, Okla., March 24.—The Oklahoma Iron works has announced that it will erect a large plant on a

tract of land just northeast of the city. Fifteen acres will be devoted to the needs of the plant and two mammoth buildings will be erected at one, a foundry 80x169 feet, and a structural iron shops 100x200 feet. The present plant of the Oklahoma Iron works on East First street, recently enlarged, will also be utilized. The present force of 75 men will be trebled when the new plant is completed.

**Young Woman Ends Life.**  
Albany, N. Y., March 24.—Dying from a self-inflicted bullet wound over the heart, Miss Edna Mafe Handy a young woman whispered to her roommates to send a number of letters which she had carefully tied up in packages last night to a clerk in the Fisher Building, Chicago, from whom they had been received. She also requested that a bracelet which she wore be sent to her sister in Texas.

Miss Handy, who roomed with the girl friend on North Pearl street spent last evening reading over about 200 letters which she tied up in small packages.

This morning her roommates started out of the room for a moment when she heard a shot, and returning found Miss Handy lying on the floor with a wound over her heart and a revolver near by. The young woman died in a few minutes later. Miss Handy came to Albany in January.

**BROWNSVILLE INQUIRY COURT**  
OFFICERS WHO WILL SERVE ON INVESTIGATION NAMED BY NEW SECRETARY OF WAR.

Washington, March 24.—Secretary of War Dickinon today announced the retired army officers who have been appointed members of the court of inquiry to investigate the discharge of the battalion of the Twenty-fifth (colored) for alleged complicity in the affair at Brownsville, Tex. in 1906, as provided by the President resolution. The officers follow: Lieut. Gen. S. M. B. Young, Major Gen. J. P. Sanger, Brig. Gen. Theodore Schwan, Brig. Gen. Butler D. Price and Brig. Gen. John M. Wilson.

Capt. Charles R. Rowland, Twenty-first Infantry, was named recorder of the court.

The time and place of the meeting of the court have not yet been determined, but it is expected the court will be convened in this city in the course of a few days.

**Whitaker Denied Pardon.**  
New Orleans, March 24.—By the action today of the state board of pardons in refusing to grant his petition for a pardon, Edward S. Whitaker, former inspector of police of New Orleans, will serve three years in Orleans here. While at the head of the police, department here, Whitaker entered the office of the morn-

ing World and shot several times at James Leveque, the editor who was not injured. The trouble grew out of articles which Leveque had printed attacking Whitaker.

**Spain to Have New Navy.**  
London, March 24.—It is announced that the Spanish government has arranged with a British syndicate to build a new Spanish navy and an arsenal. The navy, it is said, will consist of three 15,000-ton ironclads, three torpedo boat destroyers, twenty-four torpedo boats and four gunboats. They will be built in Spain, but the armament will be supplied by a British firm.
